Oil Drillers At Riddle Near 1,150-Foot Depth

The maximum depth of slightly more than 1,150 feet is expected to be reached in the next few days in the oil drilling operation on the Harry Dayton ranch about three miles east of Riddle, reports the Myrtle Creek Mail.
