Court Rejects Exclusive Claim To Passport Rights
WASHINGTON — The U. S. Court of Appeals here has rejected the State Department's claim of exclusive control over issuance of passports.
The court ruled in a unanimous decision that the department's actions in passport cases are subject to judicial review and must conform to the "due process" provision of the Fifth Amendment.
The court held that issuance of a passport "is not a purely political matter" involving foreign affairs. If it were, the court said, it would not be subject to court review.

Air Pollution In Portland Bad, Experts Report

PORTLAND — Air pollution in Portland is worse than city officials realized, but nowhere near as bad as Los Angeles, experts reported here Thursday.
A smog expert, Richard Hatchard, told the state Air Pollution Authority that Portland has about 4 per cent less pollution than Los Angeles, but still could get smog conditions at certain times of the year.
This is most likely to happen in October and November, when weather often causes air to be held in a pocket over the city.
Only two cities of comparable size have a worse pollution rating than Portland, Hatchard said after months of testing the Portland air. They are Cincinnati, Ohio, and Kansas City, Mo.
The authority heard progress reports from a number of industrial plants in this area and update on their efforts to eliminate waste discharged into the air.

Five Men Die In Crashes Of Two Air Force Planes

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. — Five men were killed in two bomber crashes near here yesterday. Both aircraft were based at Randolph Air Force Base.
Four airmen were killed last night when their B-29 crashed a mile south of the base shortly after what Air Force spokesman described as "a touch-and-go take-off on a student transition mission."
A B-27 twin-jet bomber crashed about 16 miles north of here earlier in the day, killing Capt. William P. Brown, 32.
