Airport Building Fund Includes Oregon Item

WASHINGTON — Alaska would receive \$1,350,000 a year in federal matching funds for airport construction, under a bill which has been approved by the Senate, and Oregon and Washington would each get close to a million.

The legislation still must be approved by the House and signed by President Eisenhower. It would authorize contributions to states and territories of 63 million annually for four years.

The annual allocation for Pacific Northwest states under the bill would be: Montana, \$1,157,301; Oregon, \$932,127; Washington, \$888,070; Idaho, \$694,983.

Texas would get the top allocation of \$3,093,777 a year. Nine other states and Alaska would be above the million mark. California would be second with \$2,734,099 and New York next with \$2,696,231.

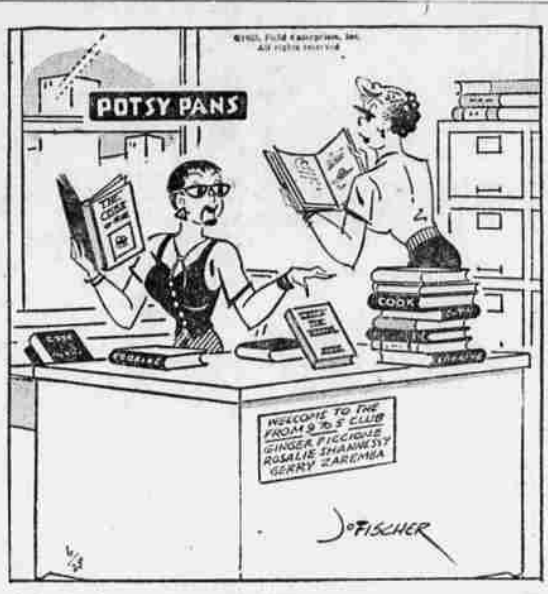
