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mediate rear are the Detroit Tigers and Boston Red Sox, just itching to wash Chicago and the Tribe out of their second and third-place berths.

The White Sox looked to be on their way out as they dropped their fourth straight to Detroit 8-2 yesterday. And Cleveland suffered another jolt in a 12-4 pasting by Kansas City.

New York, meanwhile, clobbered Baltimore twice, 9-2 and 7-3, while Boston continued its steady victory diet with a 6-3 success at Washington.

Yanks Increase Lead
The Yanks, who have won 10 of their last 11 (only half of them against the second division), now are five games up on the second-place White Sox and seven ahead of the Tribe. Detroit is only three behind the Indians, and the Red Sox, who have won 19 of 23, are just half a game farther back.

In the National, crippled Brooklyn was shattered by a revived Willie Mays as the New York Giants reclaimed fourth place with a 6-1 victory. Mays, shaking his

slump, drove in all six runs against the first-place Dodgers, who have lost power guy Roy Campanella with a knee injury.

Milwaukee drew to within half a game of second-place Chicago by pelting the Cubs 14-1. Philadelphia beat Pittsburgh 6-3 and St. Louis rapped Cincinnati 9-5 as Stan Musial reached the 2,500-hit mark.

Kalene Wallops Homer
The Tigers smacked the White Sox quick and hard to win their fifth game in six starts. Five straight hits, including Al Kalene's three-run homer, made for a five-run first inning that chased Harry Byrd and got Billy Hoelt started on his eighth victory.

Cleveland lost its fourth in six games as Gus Zernial and Harry Simpson homered home four runs in the A's 16-hit barrage against loser Bob Feller and three relievers. Bobby Shantz won it with help from Tom Gorman.

The Yanks rolled on as Bob Turley became the fourth AL pitcher to win to this season in the opener. Gil McDougald got a four-run seventh under way with a two-run triple in the nightcap, won by Tom Morgan.

Gene Bearden, sent to San Francisco when the Rainiers swept their roster at the start of the season, paced the Seals to a 9-4 win over league-leading San Diego Wednesday night while Seattle was making it two straight over Oakland, 3-0.

Resurgent Portland also hit the victory trail, defeating Los Angeles, 4-1, with a late rally. Hollywood beat Sacramento 4-2 for the Stars' seventh victory in nine starts.

Two teams won doubleheaders Wednesday night and the sweep pushed the Salem Senators two-and-one-half games ahead of the pack in the Northwest Baseball League.

The Senators beat last-place Spokane, 2-0 and 6-5, while Lewiston took the measure of Eugene, 2-1 and 9-8. Lewiston's double triumph dropped Eugene into third place, half a game behind the Wenatchee Chiefs, who were not scheduled.

Tri-City walloped Yakima, 15-3, to round out the night's activities. Spokane's Phil Page allowed Salem only four hits in the seven-inning opener at Salem but three were a pair of singles and a triple that produced the winning runs in the fifth inning.
