

Farm Product Prices Decline Very Slightly

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agriculture Department reported Thursday that farm product prices declined four-tenths of one per cent during the month ended June 13.

Sharp declines occurred in the case of potatoes, cantaloupes, watermelons, tomatoes and wheat. Reduction in these commodities was offset in part by increases

farmers received for livestock, primarily hogs.

The department said farm prices were 1.6 per cent below a year ago and 2.1 per cent below the record high set in February, 1951.

Prices paid by farmers for commodities and services used in farm production and in family living averaged the same as a month ago and as a year ago. But they were 2.7 per cent below the record high set in May, 1952.

Farm prices as a whole averaged 86 per cent of parity in mid-June, compared with 87 per cent in mid-May, 88 per cent in mid-June last year and the record high of 123 per cent set in mid-October, 1946.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons interested that a petition for the establishment of the Green Sanitary District has been filed in the office of the County Clerk of Douglas County, Oregon, and said petition will be presented to the County Court of Douglas County, Oregon, on the 20th day of July, 1952, in the 2nd and 1st Judicial District in the County Court House in Roseburg, Oregon.

That said petition provides as follows:

PETITION

IN THE MATTER OF THE ORGANIZATION OF THE GREEN SANITARY DISTRICT.

TO THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTY OF DOUGLAS:

The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent and show the County Court as follows:

That each of said petitioners is a legal voter of the State of Oregon and a resident and freeholder within the boundaries of the proposed sanitary district heretofore described in the petition of the proposed sanitary district and the boundaries of said proposed sanitary district are described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the Eastern extension of the Western boundary of Flank Fruit Farms as platted and filed in the Office of the County Clerk of Douglas County, Oregon, with the Western Right of Way line of the present Pacific (U.S. 90) Highway;

Thence West along said extension and said North boundary to the Northwest corner of Lot 7, said Flank Fruit Farms, being a point in the East line of Lot 12, Roseburg Home Orchard Tracts, Plat H as platted and filed in the Office of the County Clerk of Douglas County, Oregon;

Thence South along the East line of said Lot 12, and the West line of Lot 7, Flank Fruit Farms to the Southeast corner of said Lot 12, being also the Northeast corner of Lot 13 of said Roseburg Home Orchard Tracts, Plat H;

Thence West along the line between Lot 12 and Lot 13, said Plat, to its intersection with a line 250 feet West of and parallel to the West line of Stella Street, as dedicated on the plat of Austin Road Tracts as platted and filed in the Office of the County Clerk of Douglas County, Oregon, extended Southwesterly;

Potato, Grain Crops Are Damaged By Frost

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — Potato and grain crops in the Klamath Basin were severely damaged by frost Wednesday morning when temperatures fell as low as 19 degrees.

Walt Jendzejewski, Klamath County extension agent, reported that late potato plantings in the Tulelake, Calif. area were hardest hit and that many fields were completely blackened. Heavy damage was also reported to grass seed, grain and clover crops.

Don Jenott, Forest Service ranger at Mt. Hebron, Calif., reported a temperature of 19 degrees. Unofficial reading at Tulelake was 22 degrees, and the Tulelake Experiment Station recorded 26.
