### Israel Cabinet Quits After Labor Party Break

JERUSALEM, Israeli Sector (AP)—Premier Moshe Sharett's cabinet resigned Wednesday after his Mappai (Labor) Party broke with the No. 2 faction in the coalition government, the General Zionists.

President Izhak Ben Zvi accepted the resignation and immediately began consultations with political leaders in an effort to get someone to form a new government.

It was expected that the Mappai, whose 47 seats make it the largest faction in the 120-member Knesset (Parliament), would try to build a new coalition without the General Zionists. The latter have 29 seats in the Knesset and no other party has more than 8.

### BLACKLISTED

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Navy yesterday blacklisted Sol Schlesinger's Ideal Uniform Cap Co., of Freeport, N.Y., because he refused to give senators his records.

Schlesinger on June 23 declined to let the Senate Investigations subcommittee see the company's books and records. It had sought them in its search for evidence of graft in the purchase of armed forces uniforms.

### Dutch Announce Plans For Old Age Pensions

THE HAGUE, Netherlands (AP)—The Dutch government Thursday announced a sweeping program of old age pensions for all.

A bill to become effective Jan. 1, 1957, was presented to Parliament by Jacobus Sijthoff, minister of social affairs and public health. It would introduce compulsory old age insurance for all residing in the Netherlands, regardless of nationality.

With the world's lowest mortality rate, the burden of the aging Dutch population is becoming more acute every year. In another 30 years, it is estimated, 16 per cent of the Dutch will be over 65.

The bill provides pensions for those 65 and over. Married couples would get the equivalent of \$250 dollars annually and single persons \$210.

NEW YORK (AP)—Tommy Manville has agreed to settle \$260,000 on his estranged ninth wife Anita Roddy-Eden Manville.
