Judge Orders Finding Against Service Stricken

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal judge Thursday ordered wiped from the record a finding of "reasonable doubt" as to the loyalty of John Stewart Service. The court said, however, that Service is not entitled to get back his job with the State Department.

U. S. Dist. Judge Edward M. Curran said an adverse finding by the Loyalty Review Board in the Service case "is a nullity."

He cited a recent ruling by the Supreme Court in the case of Dr. John P. Peters, senior professor of medicine at Yale University.

The Supreme Court said the Loyalty Review Board lacked authority to review on its own motion cases in which lower loyalty boards had ruled in favor of government employees.

Service, 46, was fired as a State Department foreign service officer by former Secretary of State Dean Acheson in December, 1951.

Acheson fired Service after the Loyalty Review Board held there was "reasonable doubt" as to his loyalty.

Alfred Sulmonetti New Multnomah Circuit Judge
SALEM (AP) — Alfred T. Sulmonetti, 44-year-old Portland lawyer, was appointed by Gov. Paul Patterson Wednesday as a circuit judge in Multnomah County.

He succeeds Judge Lowell H. Mundorf, who died suddenly last week.

Sulmonetti is a partner in the law firm of Feike and Sulmonetti. He is a graduate of Drake University law school and was admitted to the bar in 1933. He has a wife and two daughters.

Sulmonetti has been judge advocate for the Oregon department of the American Legion, a member of the mayor's interracial committee, member of the board of managers of the YMCA and a member of the First Christian Church of Portland.

U.S., Germany Sign Agreement
The United States and West Germany Thursday signed a military assistance agreement under which the Germans will receive hundreds of millions of dollars of American equipment for their new armed forces.

The agreement calls for the United States to provide equipment, materials and services to help West Germany build up the 500,000-man force promised to the Atlantic Alliance.

West Germany in turn pledged that it will use American aid to promote "an integrated defense of the North Atlantic area in accordance with defense plans formulated" by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

The United States will set up a military assistance advisory group in Bonn to supervise the distribution of American weapons to the Germans.

AFL Unlicensed Seamen Bargain With Shippers
SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — AFL unlicensed seamen begin collective bargaining negotiations with West Coast ship owners representatives Thursday. But two of the coast's biggest lines won't be sitting in.

American President Lines and Pacific Far East Lines pulled out of the shippers' Pacific Maritime Assn. Wednesday explaining they want to do their own bargaining.

PMA president Paul St. Sure described the two companies' withdrawal as "nothing unusual." He said both have "done this several times before."

PMA represents nearly all West Coast shippers and until Wednesday association contracts covered approximately 170 ships sailing from West Coast ports.

Contracts covering all unlicensed workers have expired.

Pravda Complains Vital Industry Falling Down
LONDON (AP) — Pravda, organ of the Soviet Communist Party, complained Wednesday that Russia's vital machine tool industry is falling down on the job.

A Pravda editorial, broadcast by Moscow Radio, said "Machine building is rightly called the very heart of the heavy industry yet construction of machine tools in the U. S. S. R. fails to meet the requirements of the national economy."

"The ministry of the machine tools and instruments industry... has produced in large quantities out-of-date machine tools and machines."

"At the recent conference of constructors and technologists of the machine tool industry it was pointed out that certain machine tools and machines produced by Soviet enterprises were below the modern standard of world production."

Tax Commission Drops Aluminum Company Tax
PORTLAND (AP) — The 1954-55 taxes of the Reynolds Aluminum Co. plant at Troutdale were reduced \$188,000 Wednesday by a State Tax Commission ruling.

Sheriff Terry was directed to collect taxes on an assessment some 25 per cent lower than that made by Multnomah County Assessor Wiley W. Smith.

The ruling, which reviewed the firm's appeals, criticized Smith for what it said was efforts to avoid previous Tax Commission orders.

The ruling also cited "the plight of business, generally, in Multnomah County, resulting from the assessor's individual interpretation of the laws of assessment and taxation."

Federal Pay Raise Ups Portland Area Income
PORTLAND (AP) — Some two and three-quarter million dollars will come into the Portland area each year as a result of federal workers' pay increases, Madison R. Smith, president of the Portland Federal Council, said Wednesday.

He said that amount would result from the 7 1/2-cent pay increase for federal employees which President Eisenhower signed into law Tuesday, plus the pay increase granted postal employees earlier.

Smith said there are some 8,500 federal employees in the Portland area.
