Safety Council Predicts 380 Deaths For Holiday

CHICAGO (AP) — Millions of Americans were packing sports clothes, checking time and studying road maps Friday for the long July 4 holiday weekend.

Some 40 million automobiles, the National Safety Council estimated, will be on the roads during the three days in the big change of place. City dwellers will hunt out lakes and pastoral retreats. Rural folk will take their places in the city, attending ball games, horse races or just seeing the sights.

From among these some 380 motorists and pedestrians will be killed in the holiday traffic between 6 p.m. Friday night and midnight Monday, the Safety Council estimated.
