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Bonneville Rejects Low Bid Of Italian Firm

PORTLAND — The Bonneville Power Administration here has rejected a lower bid from an Italian firm and awarded a \$604,000 steel contract to Bethlehem Pacific Coast Steel Corp., San Francisco. The Italian bid, submitted by Societa Anonima Elettificazione, Milan, was evaluated at \$557,161. It was rejected because Italian steel mills are tooled to produce steel based on metric dimensions. Bonneville required steel rolled on American dimension so it could be interchanged with other steel. The steel is to be used for construction of 143 towers on the Chief Joseph-Covington transmission line in Washington state.

JURY CHOSEN

TACOMA — A Jury of nine women and two men was completed Friday to hear the first degree murder trial of Harvey John Collins, a 29-year-old Marine veteran of the fighting on two Jima during World War II. Collins is accused of the Samur sword slaying of Andrew Stolen, 74, at Stolen's motel on the Seattle-Tacoma Highway north of here last March 21. Collins pleaded innocent by reason of insanity.

PLEADS GUILTY

ARMY Cpl. Harold M. Dunn, 26, of New York arrives at Governors Island for his general courtmartial on charges of aiding and collaborating with the Communist while a POW in Korea. He pleaded guilty 22 minutes after trial got underway. He faces a maximum sentence of life imprisonment and dishonorable discharge.

LEASES FORBIDDEN

SALEM — Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton advised the State Land Board that it can't let state employees obtain oil and gas leases on state lands. Thornton pointed out that a 1955 law prohibits public employees from contracting with the state. He said that two employees wanted oil and gas leases.

Accident Commission Mechanizing Department

SALEM — The Oregon Industrial Accident Commission is mechanizing its claims department so it will be able to process claims within 10 days. Roy Green, commission actuary, said here that the present average is 13 days. Green said it would help if claims were filed sooner. On the average, a worker files his claim in 13 days. The law, however, provides for a year in which to file them. The new system means that more than half of the claimants—those who file promptly—will get their checks within 10 days after the accident. Green complained that more than 55 per cent of the claims are incomplete meaning they have to be returned.
