France Postpones Algeria Debate
 PARIS (AP) — The French National Assembly decided to postpone a scheduled debate on the bloody troubles in Algeria Tuesday amid reports of fresh clashes and terrorist killings in the North African territory.

French troops were alerted throughout the Constantine area of Algeria after rebels on Sunday seriously wounded the French mayor of Robertville, a town of 11,000, 15 miles south of Philippeville. Fifteen Algerians were reported killed Sunday, 10 in two separate fights between French troops and rebel bands. Bombs were set off in both Constantine and Philippeville but there were no immediate reports of any casualties from the blasts.

Terrorists also shot and seriously wounded a French sergeant and a civilian in Constantine. Five Europeans, including a woman and a 14-year-old boy, were wounded when guerrillas ambushed their car between Philippeville and Jemmapes, about 20 miles to the southeast.

Norblad Asks American Surplus Butter Be Used
 WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Norblad (R-Ore), concerned over the use by the Army and Navy of Danish and Australian butter, has asked the Agriculture Department to use surplus American supplies.

The congressman protested in a letter to Secretary of the Army Stevens last month that he had been advised that Danish butter was being sold in Army commissaries in Okinawa.

Since then, Norblad said, he has had letters from service men telling him of seeing Australian butter in Army and Navy commissaries, and aboard Navy ships in the Far East.

Norblad said he had written to Wilbert M. Brueker, who has been nominated by President Eisenhower to succeed Stevens, urging that he confer with the Department of Agriculture "so that American surplus butter may be substituted for

that which we are now apparently buying from Denmark and Australia."
