

# Negroes Cannot Be Barred From U. Of Alabama

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Negroes cannot be barred from the University of Alabama because of their race, Federal Judge H. Hobart Grooms ruled here.

Grooms had restricted a decision Wednesday to two Negro women who had charged that they were refused admittance to the University at Tuscaloosa, Ala., because of their race.

In the new written decision, Grooms ruled the suit a "class action," as the two women had claimed.

Unless the decision is appealed, the university is barred from refusing Negroes, who might apply for admittance at any time, purely because of their race.

The two women directly affected by the suit—Arthurine Lucy and Polly Ann Myers Hudson—said they planned to attend the university next fall.

W. C. Patton, field secretary for the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People, said other Negroes would be encouraged to seek admittance to the university.

There was no comment from officials at the university.

Grooms' decision is the first such ruling following the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling that segregation in public schools is unconstitutional.

# Roseburg Woman Paints St. Francis Of Assisi

A Roseburg mother, Mrs. Vincent (Dinty) Spires, has painted a St. Francis of Assisi. It is an oil painting, 3x4 which was presented to John Beltrac, co-director for the Blanchet House of Hospitality, Portland.

Spires, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. Bruce Spackman, has painted two oils which are in her parents' home in Wilbur. One is Our Lady of Fatima. The other is a portrait of Spackman astride an Arabian stallion, Blue Boy.

Mrs. Spires, the former Rosemary Spackman, is a graduate of Roseburg High School. She is the mother of two children, Dana Marie, 3, and Mitchell Bruce, 2. The Spires live at 336 Eastwood St. Roseburg.

# Woman Admits Taking Money To Pay Blackmail

LANCASTER, Pa. (AP) — A trusted woman employee here has been accused of stealing \$100,000 from Darmataetter's store, where she worked 28 years, using most of the cash, she told police, to pay blackmail to an ex-husband.

Police identified the woman as Mrs. Katherine Rita Hassel, 44, of West Lancaster, and said she signed a confession admitting she took the money over the past eight years.

She was arrested last night after an accountant discovered the shortage in the store's records. Mrs. Hassel worked as bookkeeper.

The ex-husband, John Franklin Huber, 49, of York, Pa., and his 70-year-old father, Frank Huber, a Lancaster city employee, were arrested by detectives after the son accepted police-marked money from Mrs. Hassel in an alleyway near the store.

# State Department Gives Approval To Passport

WASHINGTON (AP) — The State Department, after eight years of refusal, has decided to issue a passport to Dr. Martin D. Kamen, A-bomb scientist whom the department once linked to communism.

The decision was disclosed Wednesday before Judge Richmond B. Keech, in U. S. District Court, by Asst. U. S. Atty. Joseph Rafferty.

Pending before Keech is a suit by Kamen to have the court void as arbitrary the department's past refusals.

Kamen is teaching at Washington University in St. Louis. In 1947 his passport for travel in France and Israel was seized by State Department agents while it was in the hands of a travel agency.

# Eugene Walet Wins Olympic Dragon Trials

PORT TOWNSEND, Wash. (AP) — Piling up an unbeatable wash in four heats of a scheduled five heat race, Eugene Walet, 20-year-old North American Amateur Sailing Champion, won the United States Olympic Dragon Class trials on Port Townsend Bay Wednesday.

Walet had 3,715 points at the end of the fourth heat and judges announced he couldn't be overtaken and the fifth heat, set for today, was called off.

His nearest opponent in the bid to represent the nation at Melbourne, Australia, next year was Philip S. Padelford of Seattle. Padelford had 2,460 points.

# Senate Approves Four Treaties

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Wednesday approved 77-0 four treaties designed to establish a pattern of decent international conduct toward prisoners of war and civilians captured by an enemy.

The pacts, already ratified by the Soviet Union and 47 other nations, were negotiated at Geneva in 1949.

In a brief Senate discussion, Senate Republican leader Knowland of California hit at Russia for "well-substantiated" reports that "thousands" of German and Japanese prisoners of war taken during World War II are still held as "slave labor" in Russia.

Knowland said no one could know "if the Soviet Union will comply" with terms of the new treaties on such matters as quick repatriation of prisoners after the end of hostilities.

The treaties deal separately with the status of prisoners of war, civilian persons, wounded and sick military personnel, and sick and shipwrecked members of the armed services at sea.

**Bill May Limit Chief Justices' Ages To 70 Years**

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the climax of a verbal feud with a San Francisco jurist, Rep. Walter (D-Pa) has introduced a bill requiring all chief justices of circuit and district courts to take lesser positions on the bench when they reach the age of 70.

The measure, which Walter introduced here, goes now to the House Judiciary committee for study.

The congressman, it is understood, has spoken facetiously of the measure as the "Denman" bill. The reference is to 81-year-old William Denman, chief justice of the Ninth Circuit, chief justice of Appeals in San Francisco with whom the congressman has been sparring. Actually staff experts say that the measure, if adopted by Congress, would apply to many more judges throughout the nation.

The bill, which was drawn up several months ago, would limit the office of chief justice to those under 70 years. Those above the age of 70 now holding that position could continue to serve as judges but not as chief justices. One reason advanced by Walter is that the top positions require considerable administrative work in addition to judicial duties.

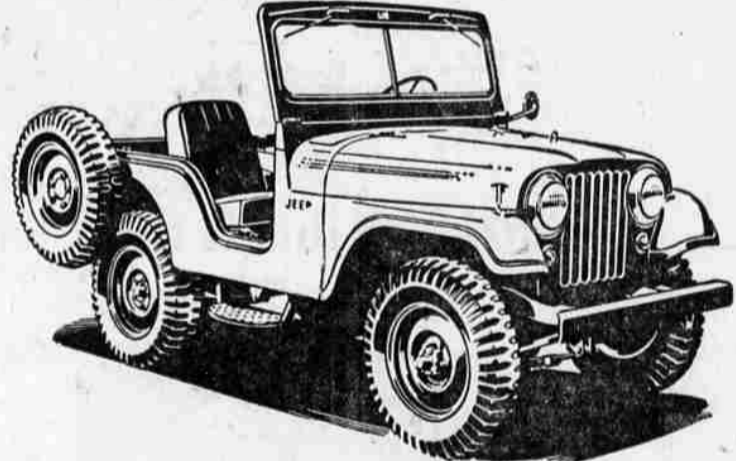
