Mr. and Mrs. Louis Pugh spent two days at Charleston deep sea fishing. They returned with the limit of silversides.

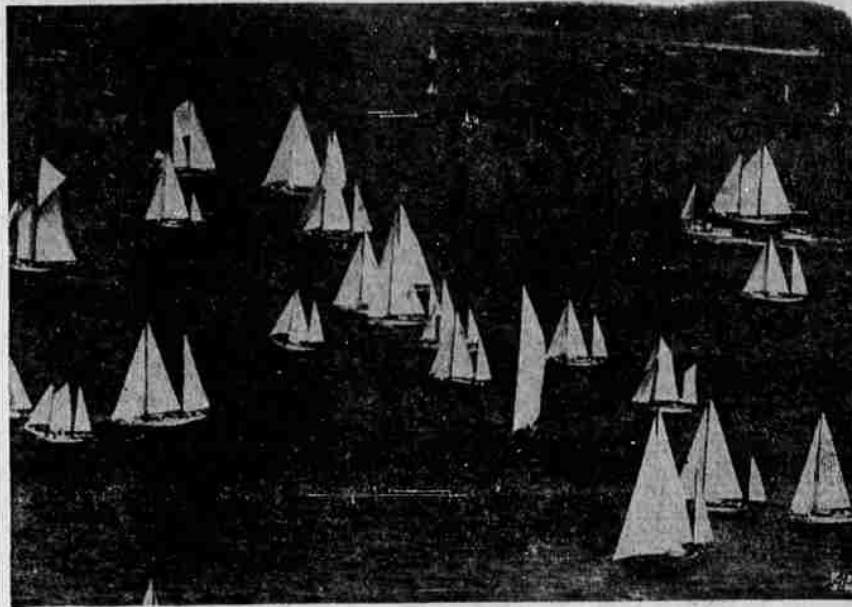

MISSOULA, Mont. (AP) — Montana State University has added another ex-pro football player to its all-new coaching staff.

Kremlin Throws Open Doors To Tourist Travel

MOSCOW (AP) — The Kremlin has decided to throw open the borders of the Soviet Union to tourist travel.

For the first time since before World War II, a number of Soviet cities will be open to American and other tourists in what apparently will be a big effort to encourage foreign travelers.

(This move has long been expected. Since the death of Stalin, preparations appear to have been under way to make certain selected areas of the Soviet Union ready for tourists. Many news correspondents and specially invited delegations of foreigners already have covered the tourist itinerary, which apparently will include the

storied old cities of Soviet Central Asia, the Caucasus the Ukraine and the Central Russian Republic.) The aim of the Soviet government appears to be to contribute to its current campaign of slackening international tensions. Western travel agents already are in Moscow making arrangements for tourist travel, which is expected to begin late in August or early in September.

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
