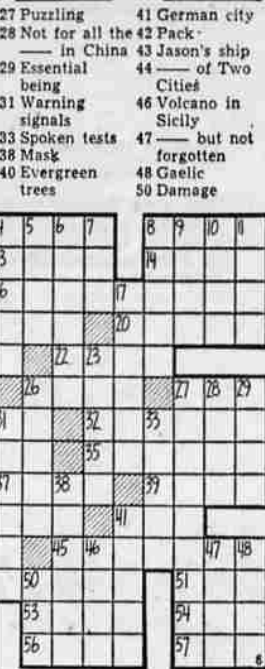
But the six nannies need to be milked periodically. So Dr. Macdonald decided to hitch a trailer behind the taxi.
