

Dark-Haired Foreigner Blamed For Bombing

MUNICH, Germany (AP)—A dark-haired foreigner with a Slavic accent was identified by West German police today as the bomb assassin of Matus Cernak, anti-Communist Slovak refugee leader and World War II collaborator with the Nazis.

The 50-year-old minister of culture in wartime Slovakia who became a foe of Czechoslovakia's present Red government was blown to bits when a 2½-pound parcel addressed to him exploded in a Munich post office yesterday. An aged German housewife also was killed instantly. Thirteen other bystanders were injured.

First introduced by the professional photographer, the technique of using flash as a supplementary light source to daylight is finding increased use by the amateur. The method, known as "synchro-sunlight," or simply "sun-flash," serves the important function of lightening unpleasant dark shadows that obscure the features of subjects in many sunlit pictures.



If a daylight effect is to be retained, the flash illumination should be weaker than that of the sun. With box-type cameras or adjustable cameras set at 1-50 second at f-11, the following recommendations will give good results:

With medium speed black-and-white films in bright sunlight, use a No. 5 or 25 flashlamp, and shoot at 8 to 14 feet from the subject. With fast daylight color films and bright sunlight, use a distance of 6 to 10 feet with a No. 5B or 25B blue bulb.

Using the slow daylight color films and adjustable cameras, the standard sunlight exposure of 150 second at f6.3 will also permit using the above blue lamps at 6 to 10 feet.

If desired, the adjustable camera user can easily determine his own exposures for any lighting conditions. The normal daylight exposure for the scene is calculated first. Then, on the basis of the f-stop and shutter speed selected, the distance at which a correct indoor flash exposure would result is found—this being the distance from which to take the picture.

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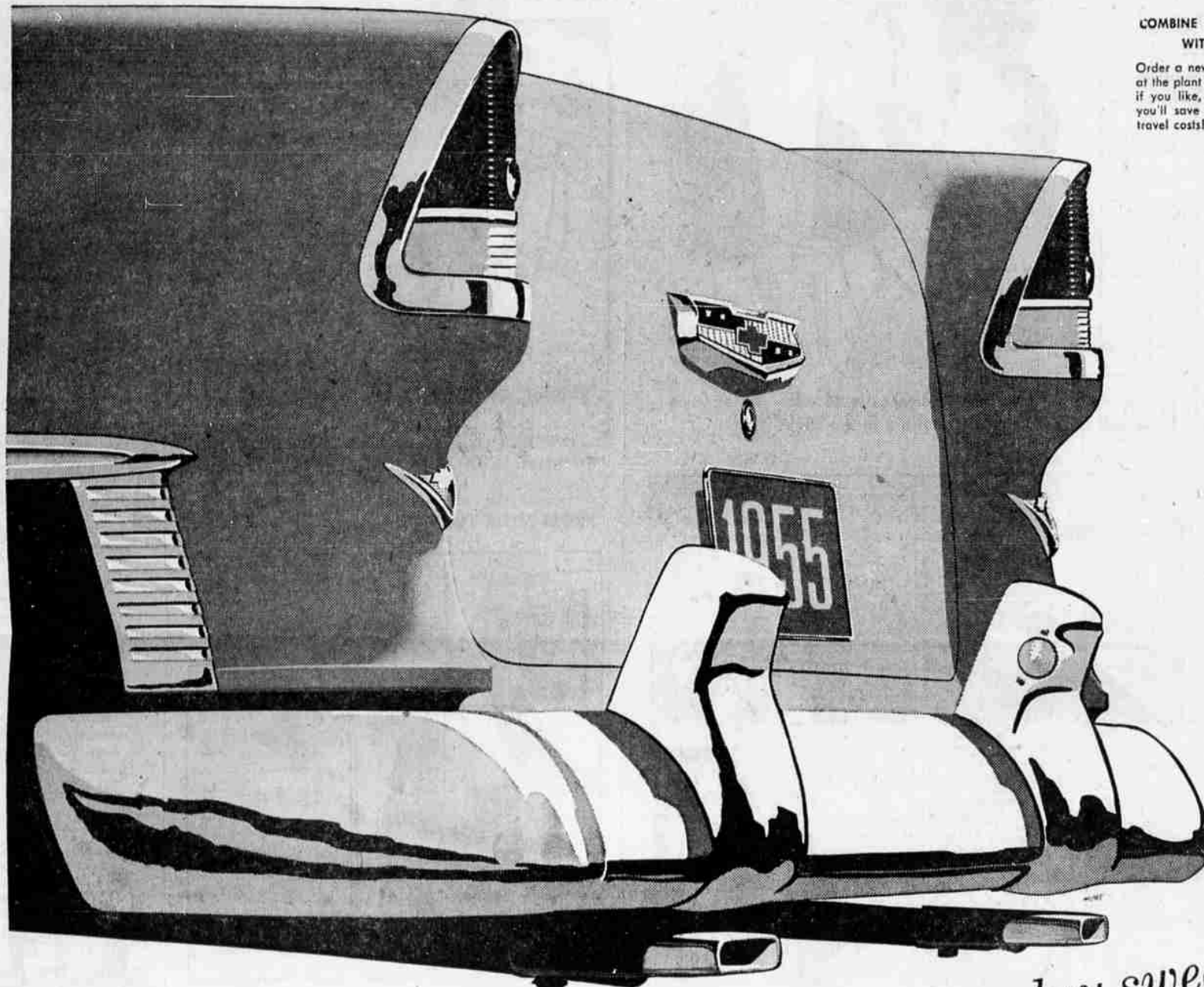
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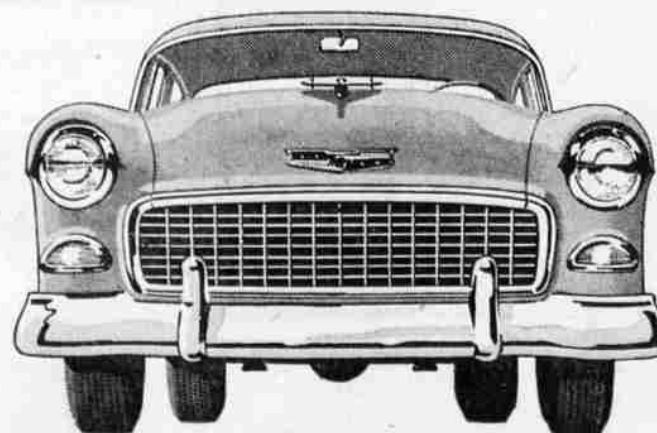
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
