Carole Jo Kabler will be back in Portland a week from today to defend her Portland City women's title which she won a year ago. Plans then call for her entry in the girl's national tourney which will be held later in the summer.

The Kabler gal is batting 1.000 for two campaigns this summer, champion of the state junior women for a second straight time and a first time winner of the state women's title hardware.

This last success makes the rise of our young heroine to the top of the state women's links world

a reality. It's what the local golf devotees has been shooting for. Now, Carole Jo can either stay on the same scenic tour year after year or she can change streetcars — the ones that climb the hills. The gal's national will be a good test.

The progress of the Carole Jo lass is good reading. It starts in the autumn of 1952 with her entry in the Southern Oregon Open — her first major tournament. She was runner-up in that one.

She won the junior girl's title in a Medford tourney to start the 1953 season and then came in second to Sue DeVoe in the girl's state tourney. She caught the headlines in June, 1953 by qualifying for the PNWGA women's tourney and defeating the state of Washington women's amateur champ, Jean Perry, 1 up.

In the Southern Oregon Open she was runner-up to Mrs. Davies a second time running.

The year of 1954 was the turning point: She won the state gal's trophy over Sue DeVoe and finally caught Mrs. Davies on the 36th hole in the Southern Oregon Open to win that one. She was runner-up to Mrs. Rowell in state women's OGA tournament and had to wait until seven days ago to catch her. She won the Portland City title for women in '54 also.

That just about makes the complete story complete. There's no telling who Sutherland's Carole Jo will draw in the first round for the gal's national, providing of course she qualifies. Last year she dropped a 5-4 decision in the opening round to the pre-flight favorite.

Padelford No. 2 Man For U. S. In Olympics

PORT TOWNSEND, Wash. (AP) — Philip Padelford of Seattle will be the No. 2 man for the United States in Dragon sailing boat racing in the 1956 Olympic Games. But he will compete only if the No. 1 boater is unable to go to Australia.

Padelford earned the runnerup berth Thursday with a victory in the fifth heat in three days of trials on Port Townsend Bay. Eugene Waleit III, of New Orleans, the North American amateur sailing champion, took the No. 1 spot Wednesday.

Padelford's victory Thursday gave him 2,987 points. Art Armstrong, also of Seattle, was next with 2,339. Waleit's winning total was 4,719.

Tommy Heath, Manager Of Seals Gets Suspension

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Tommy Heath, San Francisco Seals manager, is taking a three-day vacation in the first suspension in his nine-year career as a baseball club manager.

Claire Goodwin, Pacific Coast League president, called the suspension "just a little vacation." Heath also was fined \$50.

"Tommy's OK," Goodwin said Thursday night. "He's a good fellow. But he gets a little too excited at times."

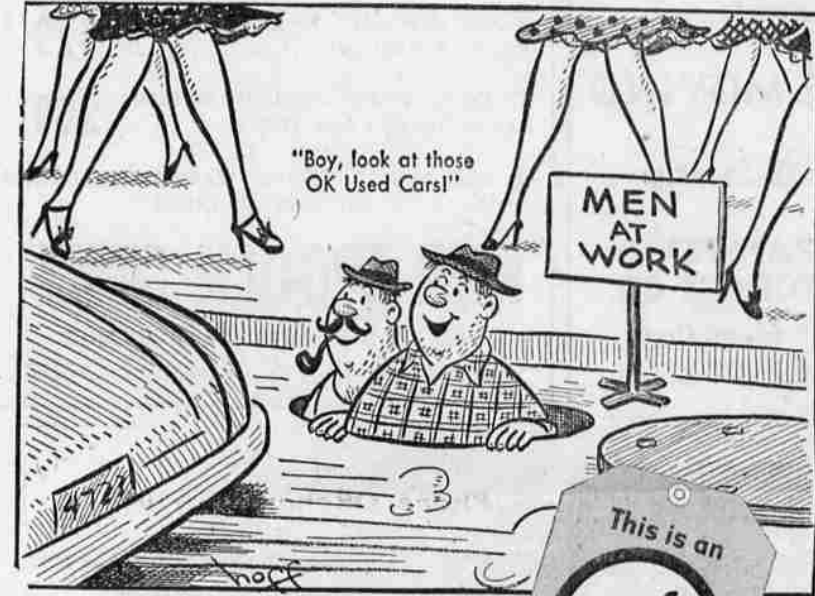

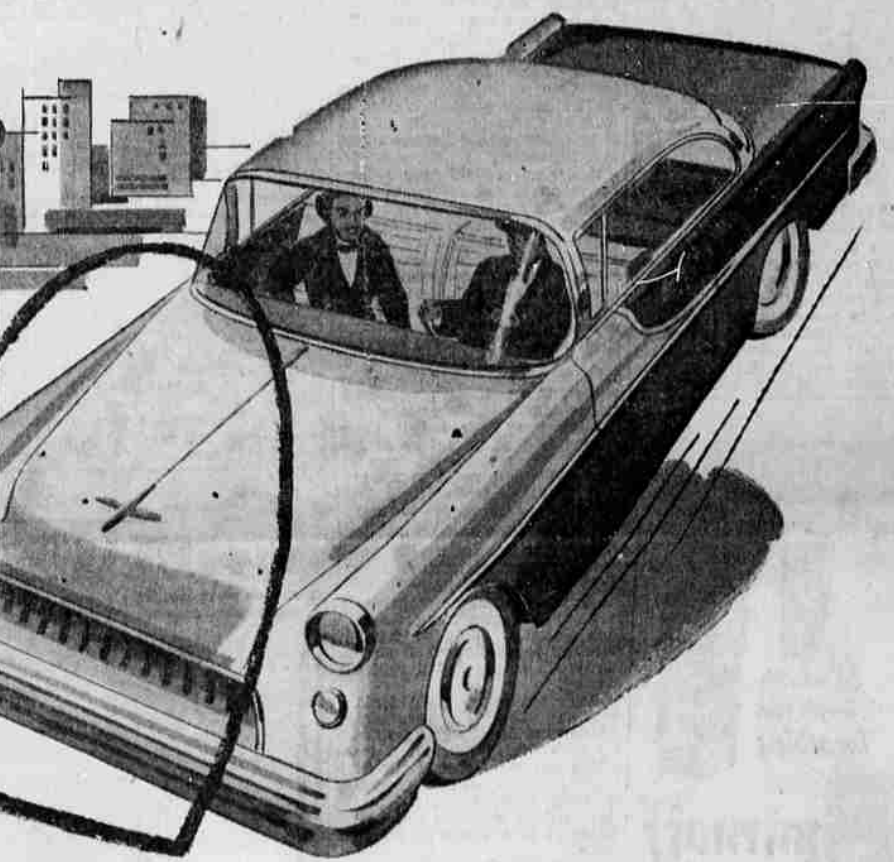
