

June Employment Rose To New Record High

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of Labor Mitchell told a news conference this week that employment rose in June to a new high.

At the same time, Mitchell said, the June employment figures will show a "smaller than seasonal rise in unemployment." This, he said, will result in a seasonally adjusted unemployment level which would be the lowest in one and one-half years.

"It seems to me," Mitchell added, "that we can expect increased employment and declining unemployment in the fall. This should be the best year in history for American labor."
