

## Bend Loggers Bounce Roseburg Chiefs Twice

A four-run Bend rally in the top of the eighth inning of Sunday afternoon's Southern Oregon League game at Finlay Field cost Roseburg's Chiefs a chance for a split of the two-game weekend series. The visiting Loggers took 8-0 and 9-6 decisions Saturday night and Sunday.

There were no further details immediately available.

With the All-Star game break at hand, the New York Yankees hold a five-game lead over the Cleveland Indians, who are a length in front of the White Sox. Ten days ago, the Yanks were 5 1/2 games to the good with the White Sox second—1 1/2 up on the Indians.

Detroit, fourth when the 10 days started and 9 1/2 games behind, now is fifth victim of the onrushing Boston Red Sox. The Sox, with the incomparable Ted Williams, had a 9-1 record for the 10 days, taking over fourth place seven games behind the Yanks and 5 1/2 ahead of the Tigers.
