## Major Legislation Status

WASHINGTON (AP)—The status of major legislation at the end of this week:

**Foreign:** The President has signed bills permitting use of U. S. troops to defend Formosa and extending the reciprocal trade program, with additional tariff-cutting power. The Senate has ratified a mutual assistance pact with Formosa and a treaty bringing West Germany into the North Atlantic defense setup; no House action is required. A bill extending the foreign-aid program has been signed by the President, and a separate bill financing the program will be considered by the House next week.

**Military:** The President has signed bills raising the pay of military personnel and extending "the draft act and the doctor-dental draft. The House has sent to the Senate a bill authorizing a \$1,300,000 shipbuilding program. Both branches have passed bills authorizing a \$2,300,000,000 military and a 270 million dollar atomic energy construction program and appropriating \$31,800,000,000 to finance the Defense Department. The House has sent to the Senate a military reserve bill.

**Veterans:** The President has signed a bill continuing eligibility of veterans for government-financed educational benefits.

**Schools:** Bills to provide federal aid for schools are pending in Senate and House committees.

**Statehood:** The House has killed a bill to admit Hawaii and Alaska to statehood. There has been no Senate action.

**Pay raises:** The President has signed bills raising the pay of congressmen, federal judges, postal employees and civil service workers.

**Postal rates:** Legislation to increase rates is bottled up in the House Postoffice Committee.

**Wages:** The Senate has passed, and the House Labor Committee has approved, a bill boosting the minimum wage in interstate in-

### Radio, TV Interference Source Being Studied

OREGON STATE COLLEGE — Radio and television interference from high voltage transmission lines will be studied this year by the Oregon State College engineering experiment station under a new \$8600 research grant from Bonneville Power Administration. The study is expected to provide information helpful to both government and private electrical power suppliers in reducing radio and TV noise and picture distortion. It is the latest in a group of projects conducted by OSC for Bonneville since 1951.

## 'Carmen Jones' Offends Russians

MOSCOW (AP)—Pravda has denounced the American film "Carmen Jones." What seems to shock the organ of the Soviet Communist party more than anything else is the fact that this version of the Bizet opera is played by an all-Negro cast.

"The entire dramatic personnel consists of Negroes," the paper remarks and then goes on to give a resume of the plot as it was revised to be set in the American South.

"We see before us standard crime and American comics in music," Pravda remarks. "How can such cheap trash be combined with the deep artistic and realistic music of Bizet?"

"Why was it necessary to turn Spaniards into Negroes? A treader into a boxer? The lovely fascinating Carmen into a prostitute, its deep drama into a cheap detective play?"

"Such is the 'aesthetics' of American imperialism."

The opera "Carmen" is given in Russian in Moscow. The atmosphere of the production is about as French as Magnetogorsk and as Spanish as Petropovlask.
