Nationalist Take Dim View Of Civil Conflict

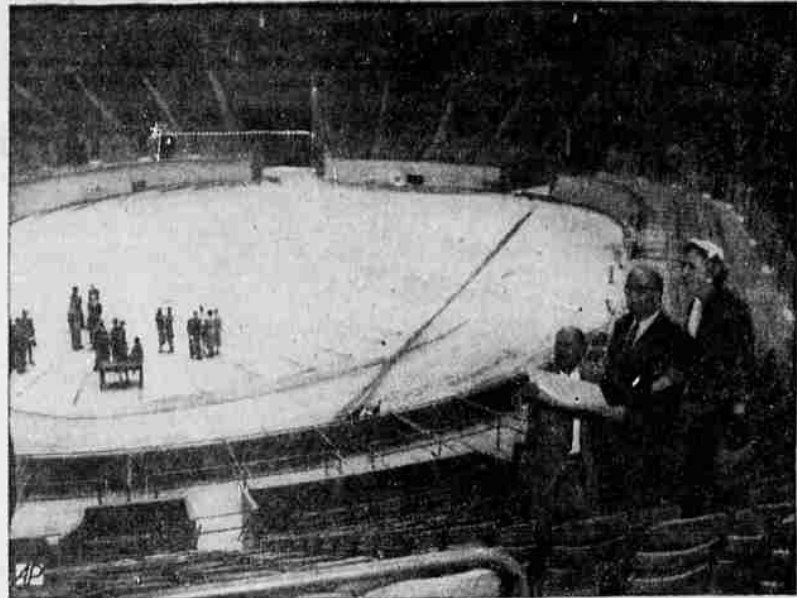
TAIPEI — Chinese Nationalist newspapers here took a serious view of civil conflict reported in the mountain kingdom of Laos. The official Central Daily News said: "The Pathet Lao invasion of Laos was engineered by Soviet Russia and Red China to create a tense situation in Asia before the big Four summit meeting at Geneva."
"The Communists hope to force the West to agree to a discussion of Asian problems by the Big Four."
The newspaper predicted that the Communists would "launch aggression also in Cambodia and Thailand" and added invasion of Laos is a calculated insult to the SEATO nations and a merciless test for them.
"If these nations hit the aggressors hard, Soviet Russia and Red China will retreat. If not, their aggression will spread."

Warden Issues Get-Tough Order At Walla Walla

WALLA WALLA, Wash. — Guards were under orders of Warden Lawrence Delmore Jr. Tuesday to "lock the damned place up, get the hell out and call me immediately" if they sense any new trouble at the state penitentiary, scene of last week's short-lived rebellion.
Delmore issued the orders Monday after guards reported increasing tension among inmates over reports some prisoners involved in the rebellion may be transferred to Eastern State Hospital at Medical Lake.
The warden said prisoners huddled in little groups in the prison yard Monday afternoon after reading newspaper accounts of announced plans of a state official to move some of the rebels to Medical Lake.
Dr. Thomas A. Harris, state director of institutions, who was a key figure in negotiations to end the rebellion, disclosed plans last week to move "hotheads" from the prison to Eastern State to prevent other uprisings.

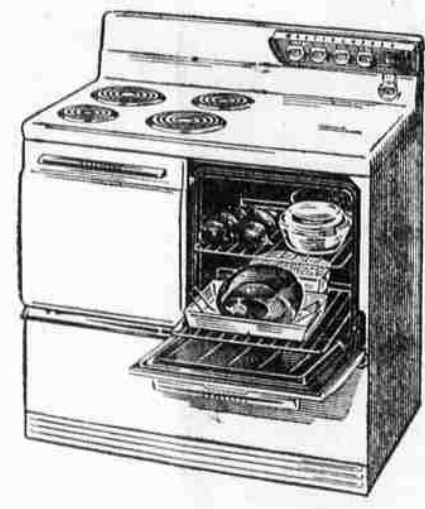

Crop Forecasts For Current Year

WASHINGTON — The Agriculture Department this week forecast this year's wheat crop at 860,331,000 bushels and the corn crop at 3,449,667,000 bushels.
The wheat figure is 15,116,000 bushels more than 845,215,000 bushels forecast a month ago. It compares with last year's production of 929,781,000 bushels and with the 10-year average of 1,154,073,000 bushels.
The corn estimate—the first of the year for the crop—compared with 2,954,639,000 bushels produced last year and an average of 3,080,115,000 for the 10-year (1944-53) average.
Wheat is being grown under a rigid marketing quota program designed to prevent the accumulation of additional surplus supplies. Corn also is being grown under a less rigid acreage allotment program—effective in commercial corn-producing counties—which has the same goal.
The indicated production of other crops compared with output last year and for the 10-year average, respectively, included:

Potatoes 400,334,000 bushel; 356,031,000 and 401,146,000.
Apples commercial 105,560,000 bushels; 109,512,000 and 106,402,000.
Peaches 48,479,000; 61,316,000 and 68,767,000.
Pears 30,599,000; 30,434,000 and 30,950,000.
Grapes 3,178,000 tons; 2,569,000 and 2,925,000.
Cherries 264,000 tons; 206,000 and 211,000.
Apricots 258,000 tons; 155,000 and 234,000.

ORDERED TO TRIAL
PANAMA — Ruben Miro, a socially prominent lawyer, and six other persons this week were formally ordered to trial for the assassination of President Jose Antonio Remon. Miro confessed that he killed Remon with a burst of machinegun fire last Jan. 20.
RATIFIES TREATY
PARIS — The French National Assembly ratified the Austrian independence treaty Tuesday by a unanimous vote. No opposition was voiced in the brief debate. The treaty now goes to the Senate.
