**State Engineers Must Find Underground Lakes**

SALEM (AP) — It is the state engineer's job to find the boundaries of underground lakes or streams so the water will not be allowed to go to waste, Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton ruled Tuesday. The opinion was asked by state engineer Lewis A. Stanley. "Your duty to determine sources of underground water cannot be controlled by any presumption nor limited by surface indications," Thornton admonished. "The law compels you to make a reasonable determination by any practicable means, surface or subsurface, in order to conserve the underground water resources of the state."

**Employment Good In Douglas Co., Reports Foster**

Douglas County's employment picture could hardly be rosier, George T. Foster, manager of the Roseburg office of the Oregon State Employment Service, reports that unemployment estimates are lower than at any time during the last two years. Even the small pool of unemployed should be reduced as the harvest season gets under way, he said. He continued that the full employment level has been reached for the first time since last fall. He stated that unless the threat of a railroad car shortage becomes acute, few changes should be noted until the late fall. The lumber industry was responsible for the greatest number of job opportunities. Several construction jobs were operating at a slower rate because of the shortage of steel, he said. Retail trade and service industries showed noticeable signs of improvement without sign of letup the rest of the year. He said some demand had dropped off for hay during the last part of June. Foster said the economic condition of the area is considerably better than last year because of no work stoppages due to labor disputes. And weather conditions are good for outdoor work. He said claims for unemployment were at a two-year low point. He tempered this by stating that the change in benefit year which started July 3 may possibly increase the totals. A new labor demand will be faced during the last week of July with the bean harvest. Foster said approximately 1,200 bean pickers would be needed. He concluded that other job openings will depend largely on turnover, which has been considerably lower than in previous years.

**Highway Commission Makes E. Oregon Tour**

PENDELTON (AP) — The Oregon State Highway Commission's Eastern Oregon tour continued from here Tuesday after looking into the problem of avoiding a railroad crossing. At its last meeting the commission gave up plans for an Emigrant Avenue overpass. Monday local officials were told the commission would study an underpass at S. W. 20th Avenue and also the possibility of converting Emigrant Avenue and Frazer Avenue to one-way streets. About 5,000 amateur photographers have about 34 million cameras.
