

Meadows Track Offered To City

PORTLAND (AP) — The Portland Meadows race track, built in 1948 at a cost of two million dollars, has been offered to the City of Portland by the Meadows Recreation Commission for \$1,050,000, the Oregonian reported Wednesday.

Members of the commission refused to comment, but the newspaper said the commission might be able to take over the race track and pay off the \$266,000 mortgage with rental revenues from dog and horse racing.

The track is owned by the Portland Turf Assn. Ninety per cent of the association's stock is owned by the California Jockey Club, which operates Bay Meadows track near San Francisco.

The year the track opened it was

badly damaged by the Vanport flood. It has been in shaky financial condition since and this year was the first time it paid substantial dividends.

In another development, Multnomah County commissioners decided to confer with the Meadows Recreation Commission on the feasibility of including the Multnomah County fair in the proposed sports center.

Dynamite Blasts Rip Struck Dairy Plant

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — Two dynamite explosions ripped through the struck Terry Dairy Products Co. plant early Thursday. Later police found 30 sticks of dynamite in a boiler and cleared one wing of the building for fear it had been "hooby-trapped."

President Fred W. Terry in strong language accused striking AFL Teamsters of setting the blasts.

The first explosion at 2 a. m., caused an estimated \$100,000 damage. A night watchman was hurt slightly.

At 5 a. m. a second explosion rocked the other end of the building. A worker said the blast occurred just as he was preparing to light a boiler. He was not injured.

State Police Dept. Can't Destroy Its Old Records

SALEM (AP) — The state police department cannot destroy any of its old records, despite the fact that there is a law providing for the disposal of old, worthless state papers, Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton ruled Wednesday.

Thornton recalled a law even older than that provision for the destruction of the papers which specifically denied the police the right to burn their old records. He held that the older law prevails until it is repealed.

Crosby Marriage Report Rumored

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Bing Crosby, asked about a report he may wed a 21-year-old actress who is a student at the University of Texas, said Wednesday he has no plans to marry anyone.

Pretty Kathy Grant hedged however, and refused to deny the report, carried by a Hollywood trade publication.

Crosby, 51, was reached by telephone in Nevada, where he has a ranch near Elko. Told that the trade paper said she has bought a wedding gown and a marriage might take place Sept. 10, the crooner said:

"I wish her good luck. I hope she gets a chance to wear it."

Crosby and Miss Grant appeared together at the Academy Awards ceremony last spring. His wife, Dixie Lee, died in 1952.

Miss Grant talked to newsmen in San Antonio, Tex. At a press breakfast, Miss Grant, whose real name is Kathryn Grandstaff, said of the reported date of Sept. 10:

"It looks like somebody took a dart board and calendar, and arrived at that date."

Miss Grant said Crosby would be the logical source for an answer to the marriage report.
