

Ike And Zhukov Meet Again, Have Warm Exchange

GENEVA (AP) — President Eisenhower and Georgi K. Zhukov greeted each other warmly Monday but Nikita Khrushchev soon took over the conversation.

Zhukov, Soviet defense minister who is a delegate to the summit conference, was talking with Eisenhower for the first time since late in 1945. Then Khrushchev, boss of the Soviet Communist Party, came up. He grabbed the President's hand and said:

"Mr. President, my daughter is getting married in Russia this week and I suppose I should have stayed for the ceremony, but I didn't. I wanted to come to Geneva and meet you."

The meeting took place at the summit conference got under way at the Palace of Nations. It was described by a member of the U. S. delegation.

James C. Hagerty, Eisenhower's press secretary, said the President and Zhukov "had a very enthusiastic meeting."

In Washington recently the President said that if he and Zhukov should meet here something beneficial might come of it in the way of better relations between the United States and the Soviet Union.

Hagerty reported that in the conference room at the Palace of Nations, Eisenhower's first greetings were extended to the Russian delegation. The President shook hands first with Premier Bulganin, then

Government Check On Way To Aid Riddle School Load

A check for \$11,732 has been sent to the Riddle School District by the U. S. Dept. of Health, Education and Welfare to cover partial costs of enrollment overload caused by a population influx in the building of the Hanna nickel operation.

Supt. Kenneth Stuart said a final payment will be made following a report at the end of the school fiscal year, and the total amount to be paid may reach \$15,515.03.

In a recent school board meeting, Stuart said the State Dept. of Education has approved Riddle's application to double - shift elementary students in the old school until an addition to the school is completed.

State inspectors recently submitted a report to the department and the elementary school will remain conditionally standard until further approval following completion of the addition.

Stuart also was instructed to invite bids for purchase of gasoline for the school buses, and they will be opened Aug. 8.

Frank Wagoner, head maintenance man, was authorized to purchase a 1950 GMC 3/4-ton pickup for district use. Bill George, shop teacher was granted permission to

President Of League May Burn Member Roll

MACON, Ga. (AP) — Dr. J. S. Williams, president of the Macon chapter of the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People, says he will burn the membership rolls rather than allow them to be used against Negro school teachers.

The state Board of Education here voted to "revoke forever" the license of any teacher who "supports, encourages, condones, offers to teach or teaches" non-segregated classes.

Following this action, Atty. Gen. Eugene Cook urged that the board revoke the license of any teacher who is "affiliated with or contributes to" the NAACP. Board chairman George P. Whitman Jr. of Atlanta said such a resolution would be passed at the next meeting in August.

The remainder of the meeting

Foreign News Briefs

ATHENS, Greece (AP) — Sixty people were injured when two trains crashed into each other near Megara, 50 miles from Athens, Sunday night. Fifty-five of the casualties were army recruits on leave.

TOKYO (AP) — Red China has announced its intention to prosecute two prominent Chinese Communist Party members as "counter-revolutionaries." And Peiping hinted more important members may soon be purged.

A broadcast heard here Sunday said the arrests and placing on trial of Pan Han-Nien, vice mayor of Shanghai, and Hu Feng, a writer, had been approved by the standing committee of the National People's Congress Saturday.

JERUSALEM (AP) — Fifteen thousand doctors, lawyers and other professional men in government service and 1400 physicians employed by the workers sick fund started a 24-hour strike Monday. They are protesting "delay in answering demands for salaries ensuring higher pay for qualified work."

TOKYO (AP) — About 100 angry Japanese women buttonholed individual Diet (Parliament) members Monday in an attempt to force passage of an anti-prostitution bill. But a threatened "women's march and sitdown strike" at the Diet didn't materialize.

Pro-Segregation White Leader Quits Crusade

MILFORD, Del. (AP) — Bryant Bowles resigned as president of the National Assn. for the Advancement of White People here, citing lack of interest in the pro-segregation organization he helped found.

"I am resigning because of lack of interest," he said. "I don't feel like helping people who don't try to help themselves."

Bowles' organization received national attention last fall when he led a successful fight to prevent integration of Negro pupils at all white schools here.

Bowles indicated he would return to his home in Florida.

The Delaware Board of Education has been ordered to submit plans for integration of students by Aug. 15, following U. S. Supreme Court rulings against school segregation.
