Tax Provisions Changed In Giant Highway Agenda

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Public Works Committee Tuesday reapproved a giant road building program after changing tax provisions to bring in about 400 million more dollars in a 16-year period.

At the same time a formidable hurdle arose in the Senate against the possibility of a vote there on the bill before adjournment, if the bill gets House approval, House and Senate leaders are hoping for adjournment next week.

Chairman Byrd (D-Va.) said the Senate Finance Committee has decided to ask for jurisdiction over tax features of the bill. The measure would raise gasoline and various highway use levies to finance the construction program.

Byrd said he assumed the Finance Committee would have to hold hearings on this measure if it reaches the Senate.

In the House Rep. Fallon (D-Md.), author of the 48 1/2-billion-dollar measure for highway construction over the next 12 years, said the group reapproved the plan 17-9 after making these changes:

Changes Proposed

1. The 15 cents a pound new tax to be imposed on camelback, a rubber compound used in making retread tires, would apply only to camelback for his tires used by large passenger cars and trucks.

The previously-okayed tax would have covered all camelback.

2. The proposed tax on diesel fuel would be 4 cents a gallon, instead of 5 cents, an increase of 2 cents instead of 3 cents over the present tax.

3. These and other new taxes to help pay for construction costs, would run until mid-1971, or nearly 15 years compared with about 15 originally proposed.

Rep. Mack (R-Wash.), whose motion Monday opened the way for new changes, forecast in advance of Tuesday's meeting the camelback tax would be revised.
