Three-hit pitching by Eugene's George Storti and a neat four-hitter turned in by a pair of Salem hurlers held the spotlight in Northwest League baseball Tuesday night.

Storti, formerly with Portland in the Pacific Coast League, walked one man and struck out eight as Eugene walloped Tri-City 6-1, at Kennewick. Bill Dials and Art Cowdell collaborated in the four-hitter and Dials also poked a home run in Salem's 5-3 triumph over Wenatchee.

The story was different at Lewiston where the hometown Broncos and the Yakima Bears rolled up 15 hits apiece in a marathon won, 15-3, by Lewiston.

Spokane was idle.

Two second inning hits off Storti accounted for Tri-City's lone run. Dwayne Helbig doubled and raced home on Dan Holden's single. Storti also starred at the plate. He singled home Eugene's first run in the third and batted in two more with a double in the ninth. Three Tri-City errors helped the Emeralds.

Dials' eighth inning homer was an insurance run for Salem. The Senators cracked a 3-3 tie with a single tally in the seventh. The win sent Wenatchee back to the league basement after 24 hours above ground.

Lewiston had two five-run innings. Five crossed the plate in the fourth on Joe Riney's homer, two walks and Bob Williams' double, and five in the sixth on Williams' homer and three singles.

Herm Lewis homered for Yakima in the first.

Hate 'em or love 'em, but you've got to give the New York Yankees their due. When the chips are down, the Yanks are up.

They had their jumps, losing nine of their last 13, as they wobbled into Comiskey Park last night for a showdown with the runner-up Chicago White Sox, fresh from winning eight of their last nine games.

The Yankees needed at least one victory in the three-game set to retain their American League lead, down to two games.

They got it. Elston Howard's two run homer in the eighth inning carried New York through, making up for two Yank errors that had handed the Sox a 3-2 lead in the seventh.

Ahead By Three
It was one of those "big" games the Yankees usually win. With the victory they moved three games ahead of the Sox and four games up on third-place Cleveland.

The victory wasn't all beer and cheese, however. New York again lost Jerry Coleman, just back from a three-month layoff with a broken collar bone. This time, the second baseman suffered a brain concussion and possible skull fracture, laid low by one of Harry Byrd's pitches in the seventh inning.

It was in the seventh that errors by Yogi Berra and Joe Collins and a single by George Kell gave the Sox the lead. Walt Dropo had tied it at 2-2 in the sixth with his two-run homer. Then it remained for rookie Howard to belt the homer off Byrd, working in relief of Connie Johnson.

Byrne Wins
Tommy Byrne was the winner, with relief by Jim Konstanty.

In the other AL games, Boston defeated Kansas City 6-3 and Detroit laid the wood to Baltimore 13-4.

In the National, Pittsburgh edged Milwaukee 4-3 in a 19-inning game that tied the major league longest night game record; New York lost 3-1 to St. Louis, then beat the Cards 4-2 in a two-night twin bill; and Philadelphia took a two-night pair from Cincinnati 7-3 and 6-2. First-place Brooklyn and Chicago were idle.

Vern Law won 18 innings for the Pirates, but the winner was Bob Friend, who worked the 19th and allowed Milwaukee a 3-2 lead with the game's first run since the fourth. A double by Dale Long tied it again in the bottom half and he scored the clincher after Frank Thomas had singled as Del Crandall dropped Billy Bruton's throw at the plate. Gene Conley, sixth as Milwaukee pitcher, was the loser as Milwaukee fell 13 games behind the Braves.

Lemon Clubbed
Washington clubbed Bob Lemon and three relievers for 12 hits. The Nats scored five unearned runs in the fourth after Ralph Kiner's error. Dean Stone scattered six Cleveland hits for the victory.

A solo homer by Jackie Jensen broke a 2-2 tie for Boston in the fifth and a two-run shot by Norb Zauchin packed it away in the sixth. Eddie Kinner saved Willard Nixon's eighth victory.

Rookie Babe Birrer, coming on in relief to protect Frank Lary's ninth success for Detroit, swatted a pair of three-run homers against the Orioles.

Robin Roberts drove in three runs while claiming his 15th victory as the Phils made it seven straight in the nightcap. Robin's two-run double powered a three-run eighth inning. In the opener, Del Ennis drove in four runs with two hits, one a homer, in support of Murry Dickson's seven-hitter against the Redlegs.



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Coleman Beaned, Back In Hospital

CHICAGO UP — Infielder Jerry Coleman, the New York Yankees' hard luck infielder, was in Mercy Hospital Wednesday with a brain concussion and a possible skull fracture.

Coleman, who was placed on the active list Tuesday after a three-month layoff with a broken collar bone, was struck by a pitched ball Tuesday night when the Yankees beat the Chicago White Sox, 4-3.

The Yankees' second baseman was hit over the eye in the seventh inning of the game with a pitch thrown by Sox righthander Harry Byrd.

Coleman never lost consciousness and at first it was believed his injury was not serious. However, he was rushed to Mercy Hospital where Dr. John Claridge, White Sox physician, said x-rays showed a "very suspicious line of fracture on the left frontal bone."

Coleman, who was wearing a plastic helmet while at bat, was struck above the left eye.

Coleman, whose career was twice interrupted to serve with the Marines, suffered a shoulder injury in Boston April 22 that had him sidelined until Tuesday when he returned to the active list and inserted in the Yankee lineup.
