**Foreign News Briefs**

**TAIPEI, Formosa** — An unverifiable report that 3,000 foreigners are being detained by the Chinese Reds in a concentration camp in northern Shensi Province was carried Wednesday by the Tatoo News Agency, run by the Nationalist Interior Ministry.

The agency, which claims underground contacts on the mainland, said most of the inmates were White Russians and Japanese.

**NAPLES, Italy**

A two-engine U. S. Navy plane crashed and burned in the yard of a glass factory here Wednesday, killing the three men aboard. Identity of the victims was not disclosed.

**RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil**

The first paneled Basil of the 26th International Eucharistic Congress was scheduled Wednesday. The congress opened Tuesday night with more than 250,000 Roman Catholics in attendance.

**CATANIA, Sicily**

**Food Processor's Heads Under Fire Of Stockholders**

CHICAGO — Management of Libby, McNeill & Libby, large food processor, has urged its stockholders not to be "deceived by misleading proxy material" being distributed by an opposition group.

The committee has charged that the company "under present management, has the poorest record of the major companies in the industry."

Management's letter, signed by Charles S. Bridges, president, asserts the company has grown as much or more than others in profits and sales and that substantial progress has been made in developing new products.

It said net income rose from \$4,935,000 in 1946 to \$5,271,000 in 1954, a gain of 6.8 per cent, and sales rose from \$127,110,575 in the fiscal years ended March 1, 1947, to \$223,014,218 in the year ended May 28, 1955.

The opposition committee has said it plans to begin soliciting proxies for an attempt to unseat present management at the annual meeting Aug. 17.
