Police Tuesday questioned a 21-year-old man who formerly lived less than three blocks from the high school Stephanie attended. The man, who has a police record of sex offenses, was released Tuesday night after a routine check.

The two-day lie detector tests taken by Burton W. Abbot, 27, also ended Tuesday. It was in the basement of Abbot's home that his wife, Georgia, found the purse Stephanie was carrying the day she disappeared.
