

Ike Gets 2-Way Nod On Atomic Vessel Request

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Commerce Committee Wednesday approved two bills each authorizing an atomic-powered merchant ship — one carrying out President Eisenhower's peace ship

idea and the other a Democratic rival plan. Both were sent to the Senate-House Committee on Atomic Energy which scheduled a closed-door session on them Wednesday afternoon.

Chairman Magnuson (D-Wash.) of the Commerce Committee said the Democratic measure was reported out by his committee unanimously. It would authorize construction of an economically feasible nuclear-powered merchant vessel as soon as possible, with the Maritime Administration in charge of the project.

The bill authorizing the Eisenhower plan for a demonstration vessel was approved 8-7, Magnuson said.
