Portland Debate
On Sport Arena
Still Undecided

PORTLAND — The proposed eight-million-dollar Portland sports center should be located at the downtown Auditorium site, the City Planning Commission said Thursday.

This was the latest development in a controversy on whether the center, authorized by voters last year, should be in a central location or at a more spacious outlying site.

The planning commission's recommendation goes now to a special exposition-recreation committee. The planning commission recommended use of a nine-block area south of the present city Auditorium for a theater, an exhibition building, a sports coliseum and parking.

Nearby is a riverfront area that could be used for livestock corrals, unloading and truck parking, the commission said.

Also nearby is an area that could be used for the future expansion of Portland State College, allowing double use of the parking space, the report said.

The commission said eight million dollars might not cover all the cost, but noted that additional funds might come from the federal government for slum clearance.

Lewiston draws bye

A "produce, or else" order has made a winning baseball team out of the Lewiston Broncs.

Shortly after the Northwest League split its season July 5, the Broncs' front office told the team they would have to bring out twice as many fans in the second half to keep professional baseball alive in Lewiston.

And only a winning team would bring out the fans, club officers said.

At the time, the Broncs were in sixth place in the seven-team league. Since then they have won 12 of 18 games including four straight over Yakima and Friday were only half a game out of first place.

Win Again
More than a thousand paying customers—a record crowd compared to the 200 or less who watched games earlier in the season—were in the stands to watch the Broncs complete the sweep of the Yakima series Thursday night.

Lewiston scored six times in the fifth inning to take the decision, 10-7.

The Eugene Emeralds, struggling to protect their first place margin, battled Tri-City 14 innings but lost 10-9. Salem crushed Wenatchee 6-1 to round out the NWL evening.

At Lewiston, Yakima led 4-3 when the Broncs came to bat in the bottom of the fifth. The big blow of the inning was Jim Barrett's grand-slam homer which came after the Broncs had scored two runs. Yakima rallied with three runs in the ninth before Bill Franks put out the fire.

Eugene and Tri-City poked out six home runs in the slugfest at Kennewick. Granny Glendon and Cliff Danner rapped back-to-back homers for Eugene in the fifth and Banny Romero pounded a two-on round-tripper in the same inning.

The Philadelphia Phillies, overlooked and overworked, have popped up in fourth place in the National League, riding a 10-game winning streak that has taken shape almost overnight.

It's all come about in seven days. Last Friday morning, the Phils were in seventh place. Today they're just one game shy of

500, and after skipping past Cincinnati, St. Louis and Chicago in the standings, are only two games behind third-place New York.

Brooklyn's 11-game success story in early season tops the majors this year, but the Phils could pass that mark tonight when they meet St. Louis in a two-nighter—their fourth double-header in six days.

Beat Cincinnati
Manager Mayo Smith's club—which lost 13 straight in May, tops in the majors this season—scored three eighth-inning runs to beat Cincinnati 5-3 last night after the Redlegs gained a 3-2 lead on Gus Bell's three homers.

The Phils, lacking power and pitching depth, were brushed off as first-division threats at season's start. Yet they've had the hits when they need them on the streak and have had seven complete games from the pitching staff, in spite of the heavy twin bill schedule. Robin Roberts and Murry Dickson have chipped in two full-length jobs each.

It was Ron Negray and reliever Jack Meyer who handled the Redlegs last night. Negray gave up Bell's home runs. But Meyer got Bell on a fly out with two men on to end the game.

Roy Smalley delivered the hitting punch with a bases-loaded single that scored two runs in the big eighth.

Cubs Fall
Chicago's Cubs dropped out of fourth place with a 4-1 defeat by Brooklyn. Milwaukee stayed 13 1/2 games behind the Brooks by beating Pittsburgh 5-3. New York edged St. Louis 6-5.

In the American, Chicago chopped New York's lead to one game with a 9-6 victory over the Yankees; Cleveland went 10 innings to snap Washington's five-game streak 4-3; Boston dumped Kansas City to a 10th straight defeat 4-3, and Detroit nudged Baltimore 1-0.

Southern Golfers Pace Western
ROCKFORD, Ill. — Young golf stars from the South, headed by Medalist Don Bisplinghoff, monopolized Friday's opening 36-hole match-play round in the Western Amateur golf tournament.

Bisplinghoff, or Orlando, Fla., led seven survivors through a grueling 72-hole qualifying trial by rounding out a 70 Thursday for a total of 276, 8-under-par for the rolling Rockford Country Club course.

The 20-year-old North-South Amateur champion faces Bob Brue, 20, Milwaukee longshot, in the lower bracket of man-to-man combat on the tight 6,500-yard par 72 course.

Hillman Robbins of Memphis State, the 1954 National Intercollegiate title, took on defending champion Bruce Kidd of Portland, Ore., in the featured upper bracket match.

Two other matches completed the field of eight. Alex Welsh of the host club squared off against husky Tom Blair of Jefferson, Mo.

Eddie Merrins of Meridian, Miss., recent champion of the Colonial Invitation at Memphis, met Rex Baxter of Amarillo, Tex., runner-up the last two years in the Trans-Mississippi and 1954 Mexican Amateur winner. Baxter barely qualified with 283.

And an attorney, gave Bisplinghoff a great fight for medalist honors before taking one over par 5s on the last two holes to finish with a 68 and 219 total.

Robbins posted a final 68 and Merrins 71 to finish with 281. Brue and Blair had 282.

Cudd, who qualified automatically, turned in 287 for the preliminaries.

NORTHWESTERN IN DETROIT — Joe Greer, Yakima, Wash., was the only Pacific Northwesterner to qualify for match play starting Friday in the national PGA golf tournament.

Greer shot a 73-73-146 in the 36-hole qualifying round, just getting under the 147 it took to make the list of low 64 golfers in the tournament.

Two other Pacific Northwest contestants fell by the wayside. E. M. (Joe) Steier, Spokane, shot 75-77-152 and Eddie Hogan, Portland, 78-78-156.

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The White Sox clinched the rubber game in their "crucial" series with New York as Bob Kennedy broke up a 6-4 tie with a two-run double in the eighth inning. Reliever Millard Howell scattered five Yankee hits over the last six innings after giving up the tying runs in the third. Chicago, down 4-1 after one inning, chased Ed Ford and Tom Morgan with five runs in the second. Ed Lopat was the loser.

New York, losing 11 of 16, now moves to Kansas City while the White Sox stay in the fire against fourth-place Boston. The Yankee-White Sox battle resumes next week in New York.

Boston used three hits and an

error for four third-inning runs against the A's, then held off an eighth-inning rally. Frank Sullivan won it, with relief help from Ellis Kinder, as the Red Sox moved to within four games of the Yanks.

Win In 10th

Third-place Cleveland, three games out of first, scored three runs after two were out in the ninth on Vic Wertz's pinch double with the bases loaded to tie Washington. Then two-out singles by Al Smith and Larry Doby — with Smith scoring from first on Doby's hit — won it in the 10th.

Billy Hoft won his 10th for Detroit, riding in on a seventh-inning homer by Frank House. Hee Brown, the ex-Red Sox pitcher just

back from the minors, was the loser.

Rookie Don Bessent won his second straight for Brooklyn on a five-hitter. He had the Cubs shut out until Ernie Banks parked his 27th homer in the ninth. Loser Jim Davis walked home the first Dodger run in the fourth. Brooklyn got the others off Hall Jeff coast in the eighth.

St. Louis blew a 5-1 lead and the Giants packed away the winning run on an infield out in the eighth. Willie Mays hit his 29th homer and Sid Gordon his third.

Warren Spahn gave five hits and whacked a three-run homer for his eighth victory. Hank Aaron also homered for the Braves.

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
