Western Oregon Indians Enroll For Education
SALEM — Thirty-five Western Oregon Indians are enrolled in colleges and vocational schools under a training program financed by the federal government, A. Harvey Wright, director of the State Board of Education, said Friday.
Forty more have applied for admittance to colleges or technical schools.
The federal program, which pays tuition, fees and supplies, will end Aug. 31, 1955, when federal control of the Grande Ronde-Siletz Reservation will be withdrawn. The program is being administered by the State Board of Education.

Federal Deficit Lower Than January Forecast
WASHINGTON — The government announced here that it ended the 1955 bookkeeping year with a deficit of \$4,192,000,000, or about 200 million dollars better than was forecast in January.
Secretary of the Treasury Humphrey and Budget Director Rowland Hughes issued a preliminary report showing that rising incomes and profits boosted revenues about \$1,300,000,000 higher than was estimated.
But spending, too, exceeded estimates. Largely because of heavy farm price supports, government outlays ran a billion dollars above the anticipated figure.
Receipts were \$60,303,000,000 and expenditures \$64,494,000,000.
"However, total spending for the year just ended was \$3,200,000,000 less than spent in the prior fiscal year and almost 10 billion dollars less than spent in fiscal 1953," the joint statement said.

Pilots Released By Chinese Reds Restored To Duty
WASHINGTON — The Air Force said Saturday it has completed an investigation of the four fighter pilots who were released last month after long imprisonment by the Chinese Communists and "has returned them to full duty."
The action apparently closes the cases of the four officers who, like others, had made "confessions" under Red pressure, that they flew over the Yalu River boundary during the Korean War into the North China sanctuary.
In answer to a question, an Air Force spokesman said the pilots met a board of officers as part of procedure followed in handling re-

turned prisoners of war.
"The board," the spokesman said, "reviewed all circumstances of the confinement, treatment, and present condition of Lt. Col. Edwin Heller, Capt. Harold Fisher, First Lt. Roland W. Parks, and First Lt. Lyle Cameron and has returned them to full duty."
Heller is from Wynnewood, Pa.; Fisher is from Seara City, Ia.; Parks from Omaha, Neb.; and Cameron from Lincoln, Neb.
