

Tobacco Leaves Up Fund For Crippled Children

WAYCROSS, Ga. (AP)—A fund for crippled children in 25 south Georgia counties calls for tobacco farmers to contribute "a leaf for a crippled child's relief."

The Waycross Junior Women's Club, sponsor of the Crippled Children's Clinic, is conducting the drive. It took in \$302 Friday.

The league hopes to raise more than \$1,000 before the tobacco auction season ends. The clinic serves 624 patients.

Atheists Protest 'In God We Trust' On Postage Stamp

WASHINGTON (AP)—Two atheists went to court Saturday in their fight against a postage stamp which says "In God we trust."

John L. Manners, 44, and Walter B. Stevens, 25, both of New York City, filed a suit in U.S. District Court against Postmaster General Arthur Summerfield and District of Columbia postmaster Roy M. North.

Manners and Stevens are mem-

bers of the American Assn. for the Advancement of Atheism. But they brought suit on behalf of the National Liberal League whose avowed aim is "complete separation of church and state." They are league members also.

Their suit asks that the court order the post office not to bar from the mails or otherwise interfere with letters they want to mail in envelopes which denounce a

new series of "in God we trust" stamps. The statement on the envelopes claim the issuance of such stamps is in contempt of the Constitution.

Previous Plan Flops

Last September Manners and Stevens spent two days in Washington trying to post such envelopes and, at the same time, get thrown in jail so they could make a test case of it.

Their letters were blocked but officials, eventually including Atty. Gen. Brownell, declined to make an obliging arrest. They went back home to New York, unjailed.

The envelopes that Manners and Stevens want to go through the mails are like any other except for a red lettered inscription enclosed in a box. This legend quotes George Washington as saying that "the United States government is not in any sense founded upon the Christian religion" and it argues that is unconstitutional anyway to imply otherwise.

Wallowa County Special Elk Seasons Opposed

PORTLAND (AP)—Several hundred signatures on petitions has urged the State Commission to ease off on its plans for four special elk seasons in Wallowa County.

In addition, when the commission met Friday for the second of its regulation-setting meetings, it received a wire from Dr. Lyle C. Ham, president of the Wallowa County chapter of the Izaak Walton League saying a proposed August hunt in the Sled Springs area north of Enterprise would bring "wanton waste." Because of hot weather, 60 to 80 per cent of the meat would spoil, he said.

Members of the Wallowa County Sportsmen's Assn. said in the petitions the number of elk in the area does not warrant a cow elk season.

More than 300 different products are packed under pressure in cans so that they can be sprayed out.

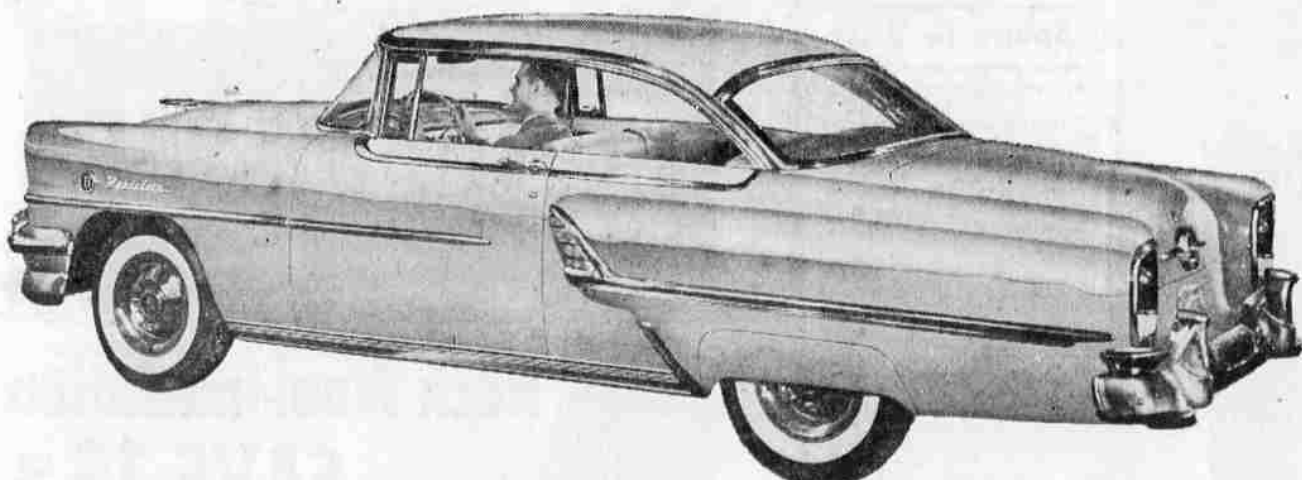
