BREAKFAST SET BY KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

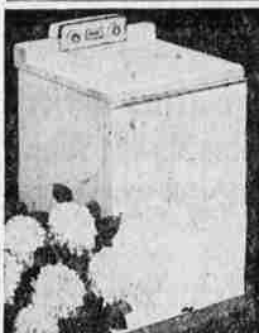
