Portland State College Voted Building Money

PORTLAND (AP) — A committee of the State Board of Higher Education this week approved plans for an \$850,000 laboratory classroom building for Portland State College.

Funds for constructing and equipping the building were appropriated by the recent Legislature. Committees also:

Noted that summer session enrollment was up 6 per cent over last year and that the graduate degree program at the three colleges of education has gone up from 207 students in 1952 to 372 this year.

Approved expenditure of \$535,000 in the next two years for 16 repair projects and land purchases on seven campuses.

Approved spending \$45,000 for greenhouses at Corvallis and \$7,000 for transient worker quarters at the Mid-Columbia Experiment Station.

Approved a \$750 heating plant survey at Eastern Oregon College of Education.

Authorized a \$2,500 survey of future building needs and campus boundaries at Southern Oregon College of Education.

Authorized Portland State College to award a limited number of secondary education and general studies degrees to students who will have fulfilled requirements through attending Portland day and evening classes.

State Laborites Frame Demands

MERFORD (AP) — George Brown, state secretary of the CIO, addressed Monday's session of the Oregon Federation of Labor, saying it probably was his last appearance in that capacity before the AFL.

Brown explained that the AFL-CIO merger is expected to be completed before the end of the year. A number of resolutions were introduced which were referred to committees for study.

The resolutions called for: removal of T. Morris Dunne as chairman of the State Unemployment Compensation Commission, support of a constitutional amendment creating the office of lieutenant

Soviet Boosting Armed Power In East Germany

BERLIN (AP) — Western intelligence sources reported Tuesday that the firepower and mobility of Soviet army divisions in East Germany have been increased by large quantities of modern weapons.

The new material has been accompanied by 25,000 new troops, presumably specialists in the new weapons, sent to East Germany this year as replacements for conscripts returning home, they said.

The Western sources said recent deliveries from Russia listed only conventional weapons, but it is presumed Soviet forces in East Germany also have atomic weapons.
