Alaskan Editor Cites Siberian Coastal Defense

FAIRBANKS, Alaska (AP)—America's northernmost daily newspaper, reporting a string of 11 to 13 bases on the Siberian coast opposite Alaska, suggested Wednesday that if Russia wishes to show peaceful intentions, demilitarizing its frontier with Alaska would be a good starting point.
"The American people should be informed that Russia has constructed a powerful ring of between 11 and 13 bases along the coast of Siberia, which lies only 55 miles across the Bering Sea from Alaska," The Fairbanks Daily News-Miner said in an editorial.
"Large scale air maneuvers at these bases are frequently visible from American territory and radar stations in Alaska follow these maneuvers. Some of the Siberian coastal bases support major air traffic throughout the winter, indicating they have tremendous storage facilities to carry them through the ice season."
"An Eskimo, whose house is an armed plane are in imminent danger of attack the moment they approach the dividing line in the Bering Sea," the newspaper continued. "If Russia has any real friendship in its heart for America, let the communists exhibit a little of it along their common frontier with Alaska."
