

Victory Advice Of Eisenhower Given GOP Meet

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower told Republican lawmakers here that the GOP can control the national administration "forever" if it works in unity for principles that the people can accept in confidence.

He also described as "complete bosh" suggestions that the American people have been led to expect too much too soon out of the Geneva Summit conference and a let-down will work against the Republican Party.

The President spoke informally at a breakfast at the Statler Hotel attended by all but 11 of the 249 Republican senators and representatives.

The pre-adjournment gathering was arranged by Republican National Chairman Leonard W. Hall.

Members of the Cabinet were there as well as top White House staff members.

There was a 1956 second-term atmosphere as the President entered the room with many of the legislators chanting "We want Ike."

Although the President made no mention of a second term, he urged the legislators when they go home to carry a positive message to their constituents about the work they have done and will do.

No Default on Principles
He suggested the gist of that message should be that the United States is not going to default on the principles it stands for.

He recommended emphasis also on plans to keep working for high-way, school construction, health programs, and a policy of keeping up strength to protect the nation while it seeks the road to peace.

Newsmen were not invited to the breakfast, but White House Press Secretary James C. Hagerty told them afterward about the President's informal talk.

Hagerty said Eisenhower repeated what he has said before — that he is interested in unification of the Republican Party behind a set of principles that would be accepted in trust and confidence by the people.

Salvation Army Gives Emergency Assistance To 102

Emergency aid was given by the Roseburg Salvation Army corps to 102 persons last month, Maj. Fred A. Dorin, local executive, stated in his monthly community service survey.

A total of 18 families with 83 members who had come to Roseburg looking for work were aided with emergency help.

The largest family included seven children from 6 months to 11 years of age. Another had six children from 3 months to 15 years.

Homeless men over 60 looking for work and several handicapped persons were applicants.

Maj. Dorin, who has just completed his first month as new commander of the Roseburg unit of the Army, reported that the summer schedule of youth and adult gatherings, Home League programs, and League of Mercy work in local institutions is being maintained.
