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OREGON STATE BIRD TALK GIVEN AT MEET

The Western Meadowlark, Oregon's state bird, was the subject of a very interesting report by Mrs. Dorothy Boling at the regular meeting of the Lookingglass Garden Club Thursday afternoon. The bird is known as the farmer's best friend, reported Mrs. Boling because he destroys nothing and lives on insects that are crop destroyers.

The program also included a comprehensive study of wild flowers found in the valley by the horticulture chairman, Mrs. Mildred Ollivant. Mrs. Ollivant brought specimen flowers of the Brook Orchid, St. John's Wort (a cousin of the Tipton weed, prunella, wild lotus, wild alfalfa), sweet clover, mint, wild clematis, wild carrot, brodia, chicory, wild geum and buck brush.

Reports on the types, culture and summer care of iris and primroses were made by Mrs. Marjorie Storms and Mrs. Echo Heard. The division and preparation for replanting were demonstrated by each speaker at the conclusion of the talk.
