# Eisenhower Signs Bill For Army Appropriations

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower has signed an appropriation bill which includes \$1,894,996,300 for hundreds of Army, Navy and Air Force construction projects.

Not all of the money allowed for military construction in the year which began July 1 is new. Some will come from transfer of funds previously appropriated.

Of the total, the Army received \$458,077,000, the Navy \$442,628,300 and the Air Force \$994,291,000.

Many of the construction projects included in the big money bill had been authorized by Congress only a short time before it voted the money to carry them out. Some of the money is for continued work on projects previously authorized.
