

### Chandler Holds Kentucky Lead

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)—A. B. (Happy) Chandler, who likes to tell about "making good as Kentucky's 'boy' governor" in 1935-39, is over a big hurdle on his comeback trail in quest of the office again.

At the age of 57, the former baseball commissioner has captured the Democratic gubernatorial nomination after one of the stormiest party primaries in Kentucky.

In the Nov. 8 general election, he will face former U.S. Dist. Atty. Edwin R. Denney, 51, winner of the Republican nomination in Saturday's primary; former Asst. State Atty. Gen. Jesse K. Lewis, an independent; and the Rev. Robert H. Garrison, Prohibition party candidate. Lewis and the Rev. Mr. Garrison entered by petition.

### Defense Dept. To Follow Directive Of Congress In Closing Government Plants

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Defense Department, apparently following a congressional directive which President Eisenhower declared unconstitutional submitted Tuesday a list of 14 commercial type activities which it plans to close down. Two are in Washington State.

The Pentagon said the list had been sent to the appropriations committees of the Senate and House, in compliance with a section of the defense appropriations act. The section requires the submission of notice at least 90 days before any commercial type facilities are abandoned by the military services.

The President, in a sharply worded message to the Congress July 13, said this section was unconstitutional and he intended to disregard it as "invalid" unless directed to comply by a competent court.

The President said Congress "has no right to confer the power of veto" on congressional committees and added that any such action by the Congress would curtail the authority of the defense secretary in carrying out his duties.

The issue came up early in the Eisenhower administration when the Defense Department announced it would review all activities by the military services of a commercial or industrial nature and which could be performed on an economically sound basis by private enterprise.

Tuesday's statement said that this review will continue.

**AEC Announces Secret Label Off Some Processes**

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Atomic Energy Commission announced Tuesday it has taken the secret label off all technical information on currently used processes for recovering unrefined uranium concentrates from ores.

The declassification action, however, does not apply to the refinement of the concentrates into high-purity forms of the metal essential for atomic weapons and other nuclear devices.

Neither does it include technical information on any new and important extraction processes which may be developed.

Dr. John Von Neumann, acting chairman of the AEC in the absence of chairman Lewis Strauss who is attending the Geneva conference on peaceful uses of the atom, said the commission has determined that the information on early stage processing of ores no longer has security sensitivity.

He added that the AEC has concluded that declassification will benefit its raw materials program by encouraging private enterprise to get into the field and develop better and cheaper methods.

Unrefined concentrates are produced in 12 processing plants in Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, Florida and Illinois. Four more are under construction. All but one of the plants are privately owned and operated.

**State Game Commission Introducing Partridge**

PORTLAND (AP)—The State Game Commission is introducing wetland Hungarian partridge to Western Oregon in an attempt to improve game bird hunting there.

Commission agents planted 265 of the birds, one and two years old, in the vicinity of Sublimity in Marion County last week, the commission disclosed Tuesday.

The bird is about twice the size of valley quail, but resembles it, despite some difference in coloration. The birds were obtained from Denmark, where weather conditions are somewhat similar to those of Western Oregon.

Hunters will not be allowed to go after the birds this year, while the birds are establishing themselves. Further plantings are planned as birds become available at the E. E. Wilson game farm near Corvallis.

**APPOINTMENT RUMOR**
