## Col. Wooten Passes In Salem At Age 67

**SALEM** — Col. Elmer V. Wooten, 62, Oregon selective service director during World War II, died at his home here Thursday.

An infantry captain in World War I, Col. Wooten was an officer in the state military department from 1928 to 1930, when he was named selective service head.

He was born in Albany, Ore. Col. Wooten had been ill for the past few years with a heart ailment.

He leaves a widow and two daughters. The family asked that flowers not be sent, but that contributions be made to the heart fund.
