Ex-Air Force Officer Gets Arraignment Stay

WASHINGTON (AP)—Former Air Force Capt. Rea S. Van Fossen, arrested Thursday on an indictment charging misuse of a secret Air Force document, Friday obtained a postponement of his arraignment until Sept. 2.

Van Fossen posted \$1,000 bond after his arrest.

Van Fossen was an investigator for the House Un-American Activities Committee for a time after resigning from the Air Force last year.

Members of the Un-American Activities Committee said last year at the time of Van Fossen's employment by that group that he had been separated from the Air Force after turning over a classified Air Force document to the committee.

The indictment relates to an FBI file on Jay Lovestone, who helped organize the Communist Party in the United States, but was expelled from the party by Joseph Stalin in 1929.

Van Fossen was dropped from his committee post when Rep. Walter (D-Pa.) took over as chairman this year.

Will Of W. W. Bonebrake Is Admitted To Probate

The will of William Wesley Bonebrake was admitted to probate Friday, and John Fredric Bonebrake was appointed executor.

Van Fossen died at Salem on July 25 at the age of 89, and leaves property with an estimated value of \$10,000.

The executor, who lives at Roseburg, is a brother of the deceased. Other heirs include a sister, Mary Harriet Germerding of Dixonville, sister-in-law Mildred Bonebrake of Roseburg and nephew V. Vernon Harpham, Rt. 3 Box 650.

Frank A. Seiberling Dies In Akron Hospital

AKRON, Ohio (AP)—Frank A. Seiberling, 85, the "Little Napoleon" of the rubber industry, died in Akron General Hospital Thursday.

He founded but later lost control of Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co., which became the largest concern in the industry. Then, starting from scratch in his later years, he and his brother Charles founded and built Seiberling Rubber Co.

Air Force Praises President's Stand At Conference

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The Air Force Assn. Friday applauded President Eisenhower for "bold imaginative diplomacy" at the Geneva Conference.

The privately-supported organization of 40,000 air power enthusiasts adopted at its annual convention, a policy statement commending the President for making his proposal to Soviet Russia for mutual aerial inspection.

At the same time the group warned that "we cannot permit the rosy clouds over Geneva to overshadow the ominous clouds of new aerial weapons over Moscow."

There is no concrete evidence that Soviet Russia has abandoned its goal of world domination, the association said.

It added that despite the apparent peace overtures, Russia continues a program of propaganda and subversion while relentlessly building a base for world conquest. The policy statement declared:

1. Only American strength can prevent war.
2. "Massive retaliation" is steadily becoming obsolete as a war deterrent, since there can be no practical retaliation after an all-out surprise thermonuclear attack.
3. Undisputed command of the air remains the only sure way to prevent war.
