Winner of five trophies this season and third highest in points at the hardtop auto races is Whitey Dage, 27, of Glendale. Wife Jessie and children, Richard, 5, Jerrie Rae, 3, and Karen, 5 months, are proud of his record. He won the first trophy given at the Grants Pass track, and, also, the first one on the Speedway opening day. He took top honors in the fast heat and A main that day. Whitey started racing at the fairgrounds in 1931. He's towed to Portland, Salem, Eugene, Medford, Grants Pass and Coos Bay. He set the track record at the old track in Medford, won a B main, a fast heat, and tied for first in an A main event. At the new track he's taken a fast heat, an A trophy, and an A main. Driving car 77 owned by Rick Standley, Whitey broke the track record at Coos Bay the Fourth of July weekend this year. He timed at 19.03 seconds. He topped top money in the A main the same day. Car 77 is a 1934 Ford with a 180 h.p. motor.

Local Hardtoppers Race At Coos Bay

Local hardtop auto drivers journeying to Coos Bay for Sunday's afternoon race were Sam Croucher, Duane Ireland, and Norm Root. Croucher in car No. 49, had trouble controlling his car the first few laps, but settled down to take third place in the first heat and fourth in the B main. Joining the Coos Bay Racing Assn. Sunday, Ireland, in car No. 78, placed third in the B trophy dash and barely missed a Coos Bay car out of third in the second heat. In the B main, Ireland came from 18th place to third in the fourth lap when a car spun on the north turn into him, involving the two cars behind also. All drivers were uninjured and damage to cars minor though it took some time to untangle them. He finished near the end. Norm Root in car No. 54, was on the track for the first time. Unused to the dust and chuck holes in the track, he lapped in the heat and, after several hard jolts in the main, pulled out so that he wouldn't break an axle.

You can't always tell the depth of the well by the length of the handle on the pump. Which is to say, both Cleveland and New York have won six of their last seven games in the ding-dong American League race, yet the Yankees have pushed the Indians out of first place. The Yanks, who have played and won one more game than the Tribe, slipped back into the lead by half a game yesterday, walking off with their second doubleheader sweep at Baltimore in two days, 5-4 and 12-6.

Cleveland and third-place Chicago, now 1 1/2 games behind, were idle. Boston Wins In the only other game, fourth-place Boston stayed 3 1/2 games back by smacking Washington 8-4 in way of a warmup for yet another crucial series with the Yankees opening tonight in Boston. Cleveland gets back to action tonight at Detroit and the White Sox play at home against Kansas City.

Home runs powered the Yanks back into the driver's seat, with Hank Bauer's solo shot in the ninth inning, his third in three games, breaking up a 4-4 tie in the opener. In the second game, Mickey Mantle unloaded his 28th with two men on to give the Yanks an 8-0 lead in the fourth, then belted No. 29 to make it 10-2 in the sixth inning.

Kucks Wins Rookie Johnny Kucks was the first-game winner, relieving Bob Wiseler after the last-place Orioles got four in the fifth. The Yanks then started Rip Coleman, added to the roster Sunday from Denver, and he got his first major league victory with the relief help of Bob Grim, back from the disabled list, in the nightcap.
