The Past Noble Grands Club will hold a picnic for members and their families at 6:30 p.m. Friday, Aug. 19, at Umpqua Park.

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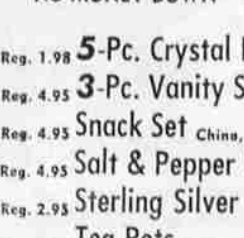
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
