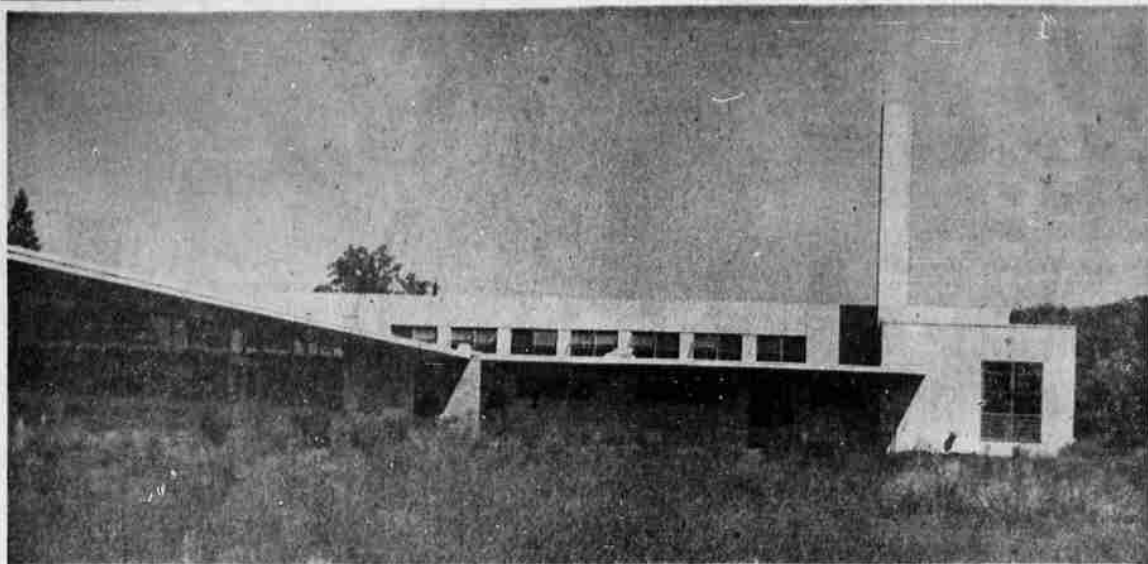
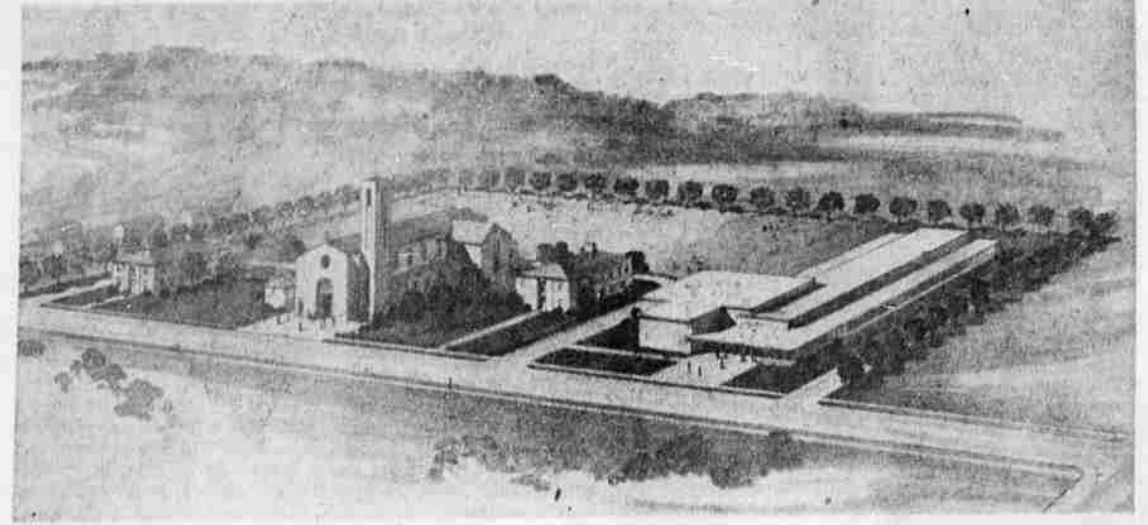

Myrtle Creek Expects 1,650 Myrtle Creek Library Facilities Centralized

Al Neet, superintendent of School District 19, reported that he anticipates a registration of 1650 students at the beginning of the fall term. This figure may vary some due to the changes in the industry of Myrtle Creek, reports correspondent Ruth M. Evans.

Major improvements to the buildings this summer are being completed in renovating the high school. Inside painting and improvement of the outside grounds has been completed by a crew of seven.

The two bond issues recently passed by the patrons of district 19 will provide for a new industrial arts building to be located on the high school grounds. Both the industrial arts building and the multipurpose building to be built at the Tri-City School may be completed by December of this year.

This year there will be five eighth grade classes at the upper elementary building. Last year one eighth grade class was in operation at the Tri-City school.

George Childress, principal of the upper elementary and primary buildings, has announced that all library books in the upper elementary building have been centralized in the office formerly occupied by the special education department at Myrtle Creek.

This year new space has been made for the special education department in a newly partitioned room at one end of the cafeteria building.

Childress said he and helpers are in the process of readying the library for use prior to the time school starts.

Due to the absence of a trained librarian in the upper elementary building, he continued, the central library will be staffed by eighth grade girls under the supervision of Glen Schroeder, head teacher for the building.

The library will include periodicals, reference books and supplementary materials. It will be furnished with tables and reading chairs. Additional library books will be as provided for from this year's school budget.

Days Creek School Starting On Sept. 6

School will start at Days Creek Sept. 6 at 8:30 a.m., reports correspondent Jean Yoder.

First graders and their mothers will report to the gym where the youngsters will receive physical examinations. High school pupils will report to the cafeteria. All other pupils will go to their respective grade rooms.

Supt. Marlen Yoder stressed that first graders must have birth certificates showing the child is 6 years old on or before Nov. 15. Two first grade teachers, Mrs. Freda Little and Mrs. Ellen Kennedy will be on hand to help with registrations.

High school pupils may register early on Sept. 1 and 2 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. and 1 to 3:30 p.m. and also the evening of Sept. 1 from 7 to 8:30.

The bus schedule will be the same as last year, and buses will run the first day. Children should bring their lunches the first day. The cafeteria will be open Sept. 7.

EMERGENCY LEASE

The Canyonville school board has unofficially accepted an offer to lease the Methodist Church annex for an emergency classroom for elementary pupils. Lease agreement would call for \$600.

Pre-School Clinic AT Riddle Slated

Pre-school clinic and physical examinations for the Riddle schools are scheduled Aug. 29, 30 and 31.

The examinations will be conducted by Dr. R. R. Kelsey and members of the Douglas County Health Dept. They will be assisted by members of PTA and primary teachers.

First graders and elementary pupils outside Riddle new to the district are asked to come Aug. 29. Those living in town should come Aug. 30, and high school freshmen and new enrollees in the high school should report Aug. 31. Examination hours will be from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Sept. 1 First Full Day At Canyonville Schools

The first full day of school in the Canyonville district is scheduled Sept. 1, according to Supt. O. J. Monger.

Physical examinations for first and ninth graders have been scheduled Aug. 25 at the annex building. The children will be registered that day also. Monger has requested that parents bring birth certificates for first graders.

First graders will be examined at 9 a.m. and ninth graders at 1 p.m. They will be conducted by two Forest Glen Hospital doctors.
