A crowd of 4,014 watched Ewell Blackwell get his fourth victory for the Rainiers, who took a 3-1 lead in the first inning. Carmen Mauro singled. Then pitcher Bill Werle picked up Leo Righetti's grounder and threw wildly to second trying to catch Mauro.

Jerry Zuvella loaded the bases with an infield hit. Mauro scored when third baseman Don Eggert mishandled Vern Stephens' hot grounder. Righetti scored on Art Schult's single and Zuvella scored after Bob Swift's sacrifice fly.

In the third, Zuvella doubled. Stephens singled and Gene Verble hit a sacrifice fly for two more runs.

Big-Time Horse Racing Nears With Purchase Of Gate

Purchase of a new eight-horse starting gate this week by the Fair Board brought big-time horse racing a step closer to Roseburg.

The gate will be used to start the horse races at the County Fair this year, Aug. 26 to 28, according to Dick Turley, Fair manager. Turley noted that these would be the first races started with a gate since the big race meet of 1949. He added that "a starting gate gives an equal chance for an even getaway to all the horses entered in a race. An even, fair start is the most important part of any race."

This year's races will take place Sunday afternoon, Aug. 28, with post time for the first race scheduled for 1:30 p.m. On the afternoon's program are at least five races. Two quarter-mile, two half-mile, and a one mile race. Dr. Donald Bone, local veterinarian, has challenged A. M. Phelps, Ashland horseman, to a match chariot race. Dr. Bone, long a race enthusiast, has said he "would bring home the bacon."

Following each race, there will be calf roping and wild cow milking, as well as team tying by some of the Northwest's best amateur

cowboys. A jackpot rodeo is scheduled to fill in the time between whole family all afternoon, and for less than the price of a ham sandwich.

Pair Of Lumberjill Players End Season Over .300 Mark

Two Roseburg Lumberjills finished the season with batting averages in the charmed .300 circle as the team, coached by Roy Crain, concluded an even 12-12 season.

Right fielder Donna Bashford topped the slugging for the 'Jills with a .323 average on 23 hits in 71 plate appearances. Center fielder Mickey McKern hit 21 times in 67 efforts for a .313 average.

The team, which won 11 of its final 16 games after a miserable start, hit .245 for the season.

Margaret Blizard led the pitchers with a 9-7 record and Jackie Weber won three and lost five.

The Lumberjills were plagued with the same kind of one-run defeat that has muddled many Roseburg teams this spring, dropping one-run decisions in their final three games including two state title games last weekend.
