Kite, Water Skis Help Air Lift Of Forty Feet

PORTLAND — John Miller, a 42-year-old carpenter whose hobby is water sports, soared 40 feet into the air Sunday aided by a huge kite and a pair of water skis.

The 12-foot kite, made of airplane metal and a special water-resistant canvas, cost \$100 to build. The front end of the kite was fastened to the rear of a motorboat by a 100-foot cord. Miller then held the kite above his head and braced his skis against the water as the boat started.

When the boat reached a speed of about 40 miles an hour, the kite lifted Miller 40 feet into the air. As the boat slowed, the kite lowered Miller back to the water and the flight ended in a splash.

"It's easy to get up there, but that getting down is kinda tricky," he said after the 15-second flight.

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Fight Over Baby Opens In Court At Hillsboro

HILLSBORO — Charles Remington, accused of forcing his way into the Arnold Casteel home at Beaverton and of taking a baby which once had been placed in the custody of him and his wife, was to appear in district court here Monday.

Dist. Atty. James Gardner said Remington had been arrested on a charge of being involved in a riot. Mrs. Remington, who was in seclusion with the child, was not arrested.

The child involved in the custody dispute between the two families is David Martin Casteel, born last Nov. 12. Three days after his birth, the Casteels put the child up for adoption and he was placed in the custody of the Remingtons.

A short time later the Casteels decided they wanted the child back and started court proceedings to regain custody. On Aug. 9 a juvenile court order returned the baby to the Casteels. Since then the Remingtons' attorney has filed an appeal.

At about 8 p. m. Friday night the Remingtons, accompanied by two other adults, entered the Casteel home, went into a bedroom and took the baby, the district attorney reported.

Shotgun Threat Claimed

He said Mrs. Casteel picked up a shotgun and loaded it, apparently determined to defend her baby. Remington took the gun away from her and threw the shell away, Gardner related.

Mrs. Casteel, the mother of two other children, said they had given up the baby because "my husband was not working and we didn't feel we could support the new baby."

But, she added, that was "the biggest mistake we ever made."

Gardner said the matter will be put in the hands of the circuit court here this week. He said he will ask that the baby be cared for by the proper authorities until the dispute between the two families is settled.

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
