# Lookingglass Woman Gives Heirloom Bible To Church

Mrs. Creed Cranfill of Roseburg donated an heirloom Bible to the Lookingglass Church at the morning service last Sunday.

The Bible was originally owned by Isom Cranfill, a pioneer who was among the first settlers to come west over the Barlow trail. The family arrived at the settlement at Oregon City in 1847 and look up a land claim on the Clackamas River, later moving to Linn County, near Peoria where he engaged in farming, and carpenter work and also ran a small sawmill.

The Cranfills came to Douglas County about 1870 and settled in the Lookingglass valley. It was here that Cranfill, an eminently religious man, used the Bible in connection with his ministry as local preacher. The Bible, which is a large pulp style edition, is beautifully bound and perfectly preserved. Mrs. Cranfill, whose husband was the late Creed Cranfill, a grandson of the pioneer thought it fitting that the Bible become a part of the records of the local church. She had a cabinet built from the radio belonging to Mrs. Rufus Cranfill, a daughter-in-law

of the pioneer isom, in which the Bible will be kept. Mrs. Rufus Cranfill was the daughter of Mrs. Mary Strickland, one of the local pioneer families.

The presentation was made in a simple service Sunday morning in the presence of a large gathering of former residents who had come for the homecoming of the Hodges family. The Rev. Mr. Lynn Hodges was guest speaker for the service. Music was provided by members of the family of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Hodges, including: the Rev. Mr. Lynn Hodges, Mrs. Hodges and their three children, Shirley, Lynn Jr., and Stanley; Rev. and Mrs. Terry Hodges and Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Hodges.

In making the presentation, Mrs. Cranfill expressed appreciation of the kindness and loyalty of her valley friends during the major part of her life which was lived in Lookingglass. She moved to Roseburg about two years ago after the death of her husband an hder mother, Mrs. John McCoy.
