Law Raps Cigarette User Who Caused Forest Fire

Judge Philip Toleman of the Happy Camp judicial district handed down the sentence on the charge of illegally smoking in the woods. He also sentenced Sneaden to 90 days, suspended, on a second charge of discarding a lighted cigarette and placed him on two years' probation.
