

Miniature Hitler Heads Designed As Bottle Corks

MUNICH, Germany (AP) — A German district court ruled Wednesday that it's okay to sell miniatures of Hitler's head for bottle corks.

The court acquitted a souvenir shop owner in this birthplace of the Nazi party of a charge of "making propaganda with symbols of an outlawed organization."

The Hitler-headed corks are bought mainly by American servicemen and tourists.

The court held the wooden heads were caricatures, not symbols.

Battle Of Chevrolet, Ford For Supremacy Wages Hot

DETROIT (AP) — If the auto industry sells its expected 4 million passenger cars this year, Chevrolet and Ford probably will account for more than 2,000,000 of them. But which of the two companies will sell the greater number continues to be widely debated in industry circles.

When new car registration figures for this year's first six months were tabulated Chevrolet was in

the top place for the first time this year. Chevrolet put on a sales spurt in June. The figures showed 756,317 registrations for Chevrolet against 741,481 for Ford for the January-June period.

Unofficial figures for July indicate Ford outsold Chevrolets and cut the margin down to around 7,000 unit deliveries.

Nobody in industry circles questions that the Chevrolet-Ford battle will be steaming hot right down to the final day of the year. Ford is expected to go down for model changeover work in its Ford division early in September. It will have its 1956 models on sale at least a month ahead of its principal competitor.

Earlier presentation of the 1956 Ford line may or may not give that makes a sales advantage. Chevrolet will get a heavy volume

of 1955 models into the field while Ford is down for the changeover. It may get its 1956 cars out as early as the final week of October instead of a scheduled early November date.

Whatever comes of all this maneuvering the sales achievements of December may determine whether Chevrolet or Ford leads the industry at the year end.

The industry's present over-all total of more than 5,332,000 passenger cars has every prospect of reaching upward of 7 1/2 million cars this year. The all-out production efforts of Chevrolet and Ford are counted in this estimate of a record-breaking total for 1955.

U. S. Might Ask India To Assist In Repatriation

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Reliable sources said Wednesday night the United States has asked India to "lend a hand" in repatriating Chinese nationals now living in America, in the event U. S.-Red Chinese talks in Geneva produce an agreement.

It was not learned whether India has agreed to take on the job. It was presumed the request to India was made through U. S. Ambassador John Sherman Cooper here, but the American Embassy spokesman declined to discuss it.

The spokesman, when asked whether Cooper had met Nehru during the last few days, said "no comment."

The information here was the United States had not asked India to open any special mission or agency in the United States for repatriation of Chinese. Instead, it was explained, the idea seems to be India would agree to use its embassy and consulates in the United States for assisting any Chinese nationals who wish repatriation.

This system would avoid any possibility of pressuring anti-Communist Chinese to return to the Chinese mainland, the informants here said.

(In Washington the State Department had no comment on the report. It said privately, however, that it would be out of place for the United States to make a request of that kind.

(If such request were made, it would more likely come from Red China.)

Georgia Attorney Named American Bar President

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — E. Smythe Gambrell of Atlanta, Ga., has been elected president of the American Bar Assn., for the coming year. He will succeed Lloyd Wright of Los Angeles, at the closing session of the organization's 78th annual meeting.

The ABA House of Delegates re-elected Joseph D. Stecher of Toledo, Ohio, to his 10th consecutive term as secretary and Harold H. Bredell of Indianapolis, Ind., to a 7th term as treasurer.

Johnson New Secretary Of Interim Committee

PORTLAND (AP) — Robert R. Johnson of Salem is the new executive secretary of the Legislative Interim Committee on Local Government.

He was named to the post Tuesday by committee chairman Ormond R. Bean, who also is a Portland city commissioner.

Johnson, who recently returned from a tour of duty in Greece where he was advisor to the Greek government, last served the state as secretary to the commission on reorganization of the state government.

Enraged Wife Denounces Mate On Labor Strike

CHICAGO (AP) — An enraged housewife has threatened to divorce her striking husband if the struck company is forced to go out of business.

Mrs. Esther Quigley, 35, said in an interview she issued the ultimatum to her husband, Andrews, a steward for local 1214 of the CIO United Auto Workers representing 450 employees of the Harrison Sheet Steel Co.

She said: "If the company closes its doors permanently, I'll close my doors permanently."

Mrs. Quigley, who said she has organized a group of 45 women seeking to end the strike, reported she was contacted by the wife of another union steward who appears to be forming a rival group of wives to oppose the Mrs. Quigley forces.

Mrs. Quigley already has locked her 22nd pound husband out of their house. She said she spent Monday night in a hotel after her husband refused to leave. But when she returned Tuesday morning, she said, "You go or I go," and started packing. Her husband went. She said:

"I don't know or don't care where he is now, but if he ever sets foot in this house while this strike is on, it'll be too bad."

Monkey Escapes, Rides Rods Of Baggage Car

MISSOULA, Mont. (AP) — Some monkey business on the railroad came to light Tuesday.

Northern Pacific officials said a monkey escaped from an express car crate and rode the rods of a baggage car the 48 miles from Drummond to Missoula.
