

Roseburg Football Practice Scheduled To Start Monday

Football practices at Roseburg High School are scheduled to begin Monday afternoon with workouts twice a day for the first six days, according to head coach Bob George.

Suits will be issued starting this morning at 10, and continuing through Friday and Monday. Suits will be issued Thursday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. all day Friday and Monday morning.

A double practice session is also slated for Labor Day, the final such session to be held. The intersquad game will be held Tuesday evening, Sept. 6, the first day of school and practices thereafter will be on a once a day basis.

Following this game, team members will be segregated into varsity and junior varsity teams, according to George.

George emphasized the limited time that is available for the first game against Estacada, Sept. 9, at Finlay Field. He urges all those turning out for the team to get in some conditioning and exercise before turning out next week. They can do this at the high school if they wish.

"Anyone wishing to play in the opening game must be ready for that opening practice," he emphasized. Physicals will be arranged later.

Seattle's first place in the Pacific Coast League today was an unhappy series Tuesday night against the pet trouble, San Francisco's seventh-place Seals, whose main job in the Pacific Coast League these days seems to be keeping Hollywood and San Diego in breathing distance.

A Rainier win would give Seattle only a 2-2 split in the series. The Seals won 5-1 Wednesday in the first of their new day games.

A Rainier loss could trim further Seattle's narrow lead over Hollywood—3 1/2 games—and San Diego—4 1/2.

Hollywood gained a half-game, splitting a home doubleheader with Portland, 8-1 and 1-4.

San Diego, also at home, batted down Oakland 3-0.

Los Angeles split at Sacramento, 2-0 and 0-4.

San Francisco's first weekday game pulled 600 customers, about the nightly average—but the Seals weren't out the lighting expense.

Seal pitcher Tony Ponce and his knuckleball gave the business to Seattle. He spread nine hits. Seattle hurler John Oldham was knocked out in the Seals' three-run third inning.

At Hollywood, the Stars breezed to victory behind the pitching of Joe Trimble, who got two singles, drove in two runs and scored another. He held Portland to only one hit until two were out in the seventh and final inning.

In the second game, Wally Westlake's two-run homer in the eighth tied it for Portland after the Beavers had jumped off with two runs in the first inning off lefty Rog Bowman.

San Diego southpaw Bob Kerrigan threw a seven-hit shutout over Oakland. He put down two batters with the bases loaded in the ninth.

Moto-Polo Set As Fair Climax

The 1955 Douglas County Fair will wind up with a bang, according to Fair Manager Dick Turley.

A spectacular new kind of polo show has been signed to appear at both the Saturday and Sunday evening shows.

The show is called moto-polo and is played with six stripped-down, specially constructed "roll-over" cars. There are three cars to each side with the purpose of the drivers to try to advance a gigantic foot rubber ball through goals at either end of the playing field.

In addition to roll bars, each car is equipped with circular bumpers so that when the inevitable crashes occur, the car can be flipped in any direction. Rules are enforced by a referee, who drives a specially equipped car, complete with signal lights and siren. The siren is used to sideline uncooperative cars and drivers from the field.

Competing drivers will be Crazy Wheels Kelly, captain of the Hollywood stuntmen; Billie Hargraves, forward; and Ken Mac, goalie, for the Stuntmen.

Appearing for the Chicago Red Devils will be Captain Johnny Ede; forward; Senior Curley McGarrath; forward; and Tony Moreno, goalie. Head-on crashes, cars flying into the air, rolling over and over and at times climbing the ball—are all incident in the rough and tumble game.

Handicaps Start In Major Shoot

VANDALIA, Ohio (AP)—After three days of 16-year events, handicaps took over Thursday at the 36th Grand American Trapshoot.

The preliminary handicap, a dress rehearsal for Friday's grand American, made up the day's schedule. More than 1,700 of the Western hemisphere's finest amateur shooters were expected to go after the prize money which may reach \$20,000 in guaranteed purses and far over that amount in optional wagers.

This year, for the first time, even the novices were placed at 18 yards and the hotshots as far back as 27. Thursday's event carried a guaranteed first prize of \$1,000 to the winner, and assured \$5,000 being split among the first 32.

Wednesday the 16-year shooting ended with Ned Lilly, Stanton, Mich., who has broken 600 targets successively since Monday, and Helen Thomas, 15-year-old Los Angeles mite, winning the North American clay target championships.

The professional crown was won by a 44-year-old Remington Arms employee—D. Lee Braun of San Francisco. His 199 of 200 gave him the title for the second time since 1947. Marty Hogan of Chicago took top honors in the junior championship for youngsters 15 to 18.

Golf Field Narrowed To 8 In Women's Amateur Meet

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP)—The field was down to eight from the original starting list of 104, but picking a winner in the 55th Women's National Amateur Golf Tournament was still a risky business going into this afternoon's quarter-final round.

Yesterday's double round over the rolling Myers Park Country Club course's 6,413 yards produced no earth-shaking surprises as it set up this schedule for today:

Of the eight, chunky little Miss Riley emerged as the tournament-tested, battle-hardened competitor, one perhaps the least likely to succumb to the pressure of late rounds. Two years ago she was runner-up to Mary Lena Faulk, now a professional.

Miss Lesser, the tall, bronzed, bespectacled Western Amateur champion who is a Seattle University senior, had an 8 and 7 romp over Mrs. Dana Brown of Dayton,

Ohio, in the third round, but had to go all out to beat Mary Ann Downey, the tough little competitor from Baltimore in a 21-hole.

Anne Quast won the last two holes to square the match and parred the 19th to slip past Betty Semple of Sewickley, Pa., 3 and 1, shooting an outgoing 1-under par 35 for a three-hole lead. Mrs. Semple had taken a 20-hole third round match from England's Elizabeth Price.

Mrs. Probasco, Anne's rival Thursday, advanced with a 1-up conquest of Marjorie Lindsay of Decatur, Ill., and a 4 and 2 decision over the 1948 champion, Grace Lenczyk of Newington, Conn.

The setback gave each of the three teams in the double elimination tournament a 1-1 record.
