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Cutter Laboratories Salk Vaccine Report Due Soon

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of Welfare Folsom said Wednesday he is "pretty sure" the Public Health Service's report on its investigation of Salk antipolio vaccine made by Cutter Laboratories, Berkeley, Calif., will be made public this week.

Department spokesmen each week for the past three have expressed "hope" that the report would be issued during the ensuing week, but it has failed to appear.

The investigation of Cutter and its product started April 27 after six children inoculated with Salk vaccine made by Cutter had developed polio. The incident led to an investigation of plants and processes of six manufacturers licensed to produce the vaccine. Testing and processing standards later were revised.

Young Father Persuaded By Wife To Seek Safety

CLEVELAND (AP)—A 19-year-old father climbed a bridge in downtown Cleveland Monday and performed acrobatics on cables 155 feet above the Cuyahoga River, until his 19-year-old wife persuaded him to crawl to safety.

Charles E. Bringham, a tree trimmer employed by the city, talked of "family troubles."

His wife, Nancy, mother of two, stood atop a bridge tower for an hour and pleaded with her husband not to jump.

"My God, Chuck, don't! I love you!" she said. She collapsed and was taken to City Hospital after she was helped down the narrow, steep stairway used by workmen for bridge repairs. Bringham also was taken to the hospital.
