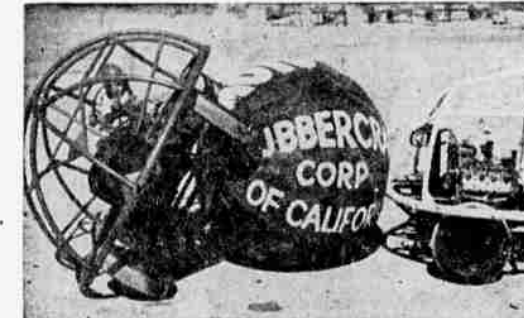

Upstream Water Resources Topic

JACKSON, Wyo., (AP) — Upstream water resource developments will be discussed at a meeting of the Columbia Interstate Compact Commission here Sept. 13-14.

Also on the agenda is public reaction to the proposed compact. It proposes a formal agreement among seven states for development of water resources in the Columbia River basin.

Included would be Wyoming, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah and Washington.

The compact proposes establishing a priority until the year 2000 for domestic, municipal, irrigation

and other consumptive uses of water over non-consumptive uses.

Idaho, Utah and Nevada legislatures ratified the compact in 1955. Wyoming may join upon ratification by its state legislature.

Ratification by Oregon, Montana and Washington and approval by congress also would be necessary before the compact could become effective.
